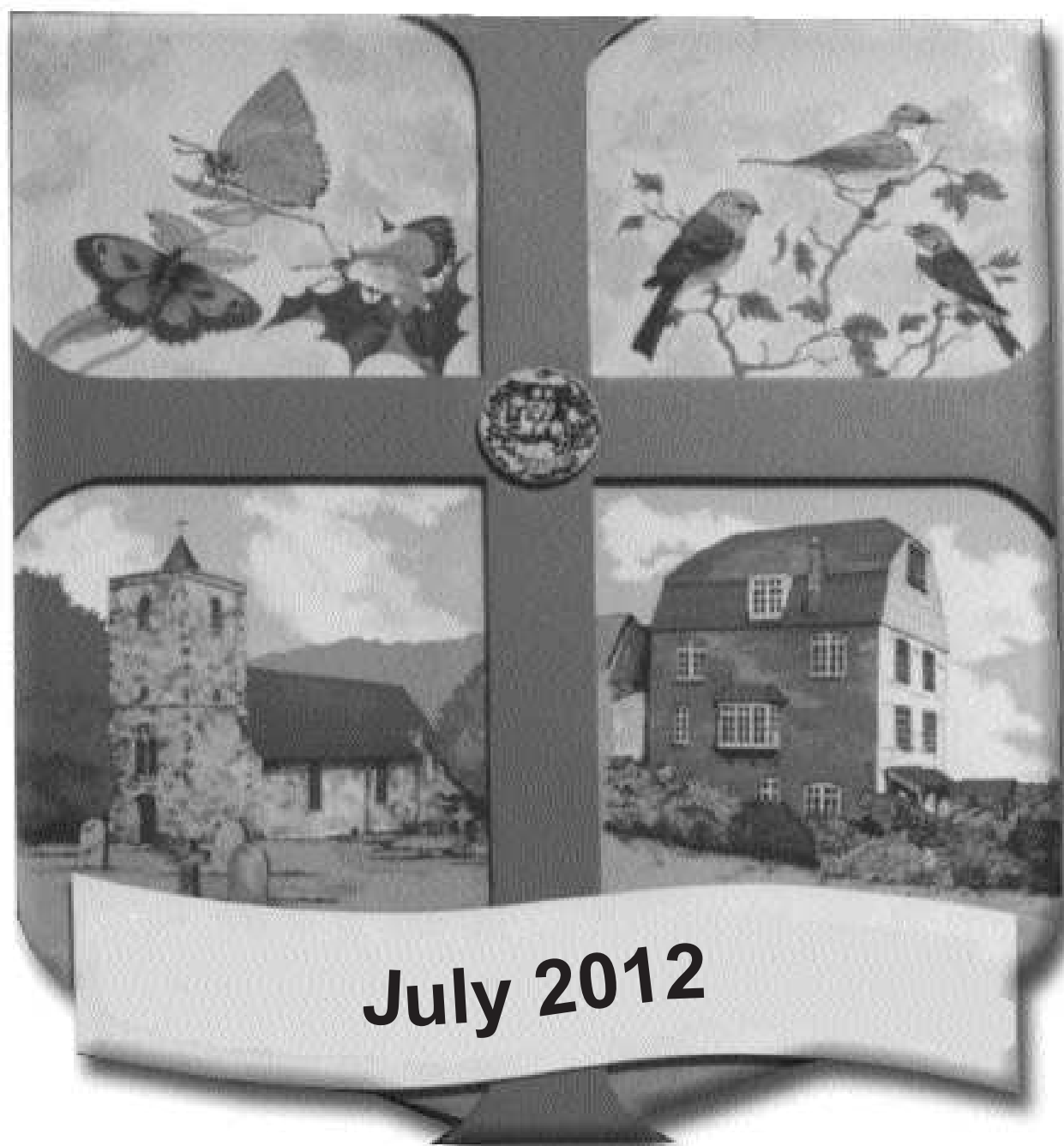

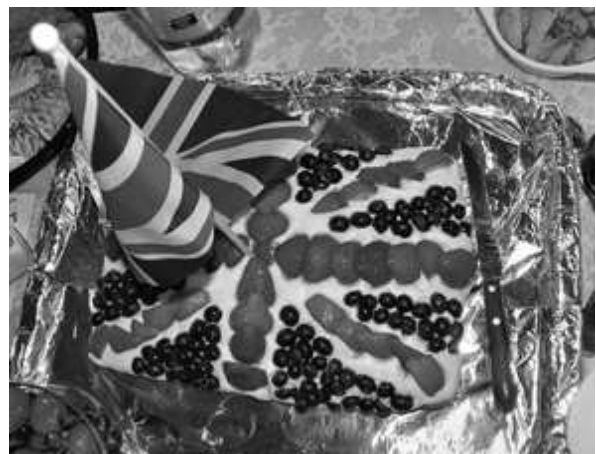

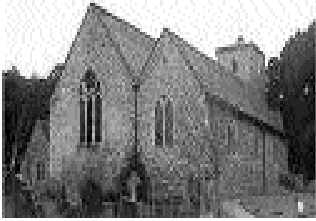

Well, at least the whole company of heaven faithfully joined us (or rather, we joined them) for our worship of God on Sunday 3rd June and as we gave thanks on the occasion of Her Majesty's Diamond Jubilee. Set at the centre of all our village events, the service proved to be especially uplifting with special prayers, the particularly moving and beautiful singing by a full choir, and in the Queen's honour, of John Rutter's 'Clare Benediction' (May the Lord show His mercy upon you, may the light of His presence be your guide...) and the stirring congregational and choir singing of 'I vow to thee my country' and the National Anthem.

Thank you very much indeed to the Jubilee Committee and all who worked so hard with them to ensure Temple Ewell's celebration was outstanding and that it embraced the whole community. Perhaps, many of us (and surely the Queen) are looking forward, if we are fortunate enough in these difficult times, to a holiday or at the least to a rest. May we all return safely and refreshed to our duties, whatever they may

Village Hall

The hall is a big part of our community and is used by all age groups in the village. The hall recently celebrated 100 years. These people are able to make decisions and they are vital to the running of the hall. It is becoming increasingly difficult to recruit people who will take an interest in helping to run our community but with the recent Jubilee celebrations, it became obvious that we still live in a village that has an enviable spirit of togetherness. At the moment we need to recruit a treasurer and at our AGM in October we will need a new secretary, as the current lady has now completed many years and will be leaving the post. Please, please, if you wish to see our village hall go on into the future we need your help. The new chairs have been delivered and look and feel wonderful. Everybody at the jubilee lunch agreed they were great. The old chairs, most of them still in good order, are now surplus to requirements and are being stored at the back of the hall. We need to dispose of them and would welcome anybody wanting to, to take as many as they need. We also wish to donate the upstairs piano as it is not used. If you would like a piano please contact Peter or Margaret. The curtains are still in the planning stage but hopefully all will be fitted by September.

Things seem to be going well at the hall and we continue to work to keep it as a big part of our village life.

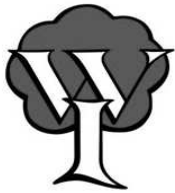

Activities began during the previous week when the village began to 'fly the flag' and by the weekend Temple Ewell was ready to party. The countdown was audible throughout the village and the Beacon was lit by Alison Grayson as Chairman of the Diamond Jubilee Committee aided by Colin Smithern, Parish Council Chairman.

As the Beacon roared into life 'God Save the Queen' was proudly sung as a fitting homage to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth 11 on her Diamond Jubilee from the people of Temple Ewell.

For many of us we are so pleased to be part of a community that consistently pulls together everyone, young old, those with families and those whose family is Temple Ewell. Over the decades our village has proved to be a true community celebrating Coronations, Weddings, Jubilees, Fetes, Pancake days, Sports Events, Millenium and now the Diamond Jubilee. The organisers, and those of you who contributed to the fund raising events and raffles, did us proud proving that the well earned traditional reputation that 'Temple Ewell always has something going on.....' is alive and kicking!!

There are lots of positive aspects of owning a dog. It is important however to be a responsible owner so that nuisance is not caused to others or the environment.

Dog Fouling

Apart from the obvious unpleasant effects of dog fouling there are potential health risks. Dogs can be affected by several types of worm. One of which can cause serious illness in children. It is important to clear dog mess from public places and your own garden. You should always:

- Worm your dog every 6 months
- Wash your hands after playing with dogs.
- Train your dog to go at home and take a plastic bag and poop scoop when you go out, in case of accidents. It is a legal requirement to clean up after your dog in most public places.

Under The Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 it is an offence for any person in charge of a dog not to remove any faeces deposited by a dog in their charge. Anyone found guilty of an offence will be issued with a fixed penalty ticket (currently £50 fine). This gives the offenders the opportunity to dispose of the offence there and then. Should the fine not be paid, or offences be persistent the Council may prosecute with a maximum fine of £1000."

Dog mess is unpleasant, spoils the environment and may carry infectious diseases that can seriously harm people. It's your responsibility to clean up after your dog. We've made it easy for you to clean up after your dog by providing dog-waste bins around the village. Put dog mess in a tightly sealed bag and then into one of the dog-waste bins. Remember to take bags or a scoop when walking your dog.

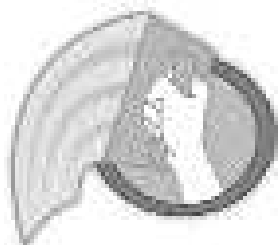
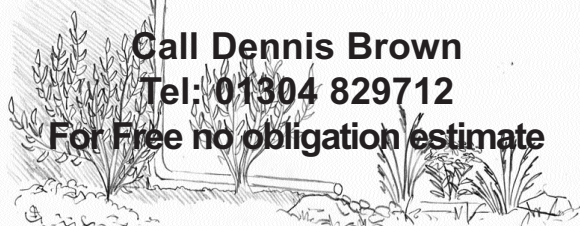

Village Folk

Those of you who have seen the splendid redesign proposals for the Village Hall (more of that later..), will be familiar with the names of Trevor and Vera Gibbons.



Because they have both led such full and interesting lives, due to magazine space restrictions I have concentrated this article mainly on Trevor.

Born in 1940 in the Medway towns, he was raised in Rainham, where his father was an aeronautical engineer (part of the team that designed the Sunderland Flying Boats). Design obviously in the blood there...

Trevor and Vera met while at Canterbury College of Art where they were both on a five year course studying architecture. They became engaged during a college trip to Rome and subsequently married in 1963 when they had both fully qualified and started to work as architects. They spent the first five years of their married life in Herne where in their spare time, Trevor and Vera were involved with conservation of the area. They are very proud of their involvement in aiding the preservation of the Smugglers Cottages [now a Kent Historic Building] which were in danger of being demolished to widen the road through Herne. They were also part of the team that discovered the Roman Baths at Reculver.

By 1968 Trevor was established in Dover, so they moved to Sheperdswell together with their young daughter Anna, and stayed there for 12 years. In 1970 son Jason was born. Periodically, Trevor also taught, part time, various aspects of architecture at South Kent College, and at Kent Institute of Art & Design.

Notable Architectural Projects:

During his career, Trevor practiced, firstly as an assistant for a year, but then went to Dover to run the branch office of a Canterbury practice, which, as a partner he helped to grow to be one of the largest architectural practices in the region. Then latterly, with Vera, running their own practice from home. There were several hundred projects where Trevor was involved with the design – too many to mention here. However, some worthy of mention are:

The expansion of the Eastern Docks, Dover over three decades.

Design and construction of the Car Ferry Terminal, Dover, in 1969

Dover Foot Passenger Terminal in 1984.

Refurbishment of St Mary's Church, Dover and design of the adjacent Church Hall.

The Dover Motel [now the Ramada Hotel] at Whitfield.

Wisdom Hospice, Rochester, officially opened by HRH the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh in 1984.

20th century addition to the 16th century Drapers Almshouses Margate.

Last, but certainly not least, the design of Dover's first Cruise Terminal between 1993 and 1995.

Dover Cruise Terminal

When Trevor was approached about this project, it was just about to be scrapped because of the listed status of the old Marine Station, with restrictions imposed by English Heritage. Bearing all this in mind, Trevor devised a plan which happily was acceptable to all parties concerned and, as a result, Dover now has an increasingly busy and lucrative cruise terminal. In addition to the Dover Harbour Board opening ceremony plaques there is a Royal Institute of British Architects one dedicated to Gibbons Design [Trevor, Vera & Jason], in acknowledgement of their imaginative design work which enabled the project to proceed.

Temple Ewell Village Hall

Most of us who have used or visited the Hall over recent years, may have noticed that the internal layout needs some updating and improving. Trevor and Vera were approached with a request for their voluntary design services, which they both willingly agreed to. As a result, a full remodelling of both the lower and upper floors was prepared and last year the plans were presented to the Village during an open day at the Village Hall. Those of us who saw these plans were delighted with how they resolved many problems users had encountered in the past.

It will come as no surprise to learn that Trevor and Vera designed their own home in Temple Ewell some 32 years ago and have lived here happily ever since.

Hobbies in Retirement:

Golf -Trevor is a member of Prince's Golf Club in Sandwich where he has been captain, and was a 'Chief Recorder' for the final qualifying of the last two Opens at Sandwich;

Genealogy – Vera and Trevor research the family's history with the relevant social history of the time. Of particular note was the discovery that one of Trevor's forefathers was actually baptised here at St Peter and St Paul's church – 200 years ago!!

Gardening – where Trevor, with Vera setting the pace, spend many happy hours in the beautiful and extensive grounds of their home;

Grandchildren - their daughter and her three children live in Yorkshire and enjoy regular visits to this area;

The Arts in general, sketching and photography;

In conclusion, I do so hope you will agree that we are lucky to have both Trevor and Vera living in our midst.
