After a very cold and wet winter it is hard to believe we are rapidly approaching the longest day of the year already with April passing in the blink of an eye. However during that month the Government made some changes to the Benefit Cap.

There was a cap on the amount of benefits a working age household can claim as from the 15th April, starting with four pilot areas, two in North and two in South London. The idea behind this capping is to ensure that families on benefits are not better off compared to those who are working. The cap will be gradually introduced through out the country from July to September 2013. The cap will be calculated on the average income of a working family and the amounts are set out as follows:

£350 per week, for single adults and £500 per week for couples, with or without children or lone parents.

In relation to the 'capping', some benefits will be disregarded when calculating the family's income. These will be: Bereavement payment, Council Tax benefit/Localized Council Tax Support, Discretionary housing payments, Social Fund Payments, Pension Credits, Residency Order Payments, Statutory adoption/maternity/paternity/sick pay, Winter Fuel Allowance.

Some families will be exempt from the capping if an individual, a partner, or children they are responsible for (living with them in the household) and are entitled to any of the following:- Working Tax Credit, Attendance Allowance, The Support Component of Employment and Support Allowance, War widow/widower pension, Disability Living Allowance or to be replaced soon by PIP, Personal Independence Payment, Industrial Injuries Benefit, Armed Forces Compensation Scheme, War Pension Scheme payments/War disablement pension.

There will be a grace period where the cap will not be applied for 39 weeks to those who have been in continuous employment for the previous 12 months. Should you have any questions, on how the benefit cap will or could affect you ,then contact the DWP helpline on 0845 605 7064.

State Pension

The implementation of the proposed single tier state pension rate of £144 per week will be rolled out earlier than planned with the new system anticipated by 2016. This means anyone reaching state pension age before the new systems takes effect will receive their pension under the current system. Anyone reaching state pension age after the new single tier system starts will be subjected to a calculation under today's rules and a further calculation under the new rules. This should

provide transitional protection for those reaching state pension age soon after the introduction of the new system. Effectively those babies born from 1950 onwards will receive up to £144 per week and those up to 1949 will be on the old rate of £115 per week.

Finally, a male/female team have been cold calling, targeting the elderly stating they are from Age Concern, having gained entry, he steals money/medication whilst she keeps elderly person talking. First clue, Age Concern is now Age UK, refuse these criminals entry, Age UK never cold calls. Obtain as much description of offenders as possible and call police IMMEDIATELY.



As a 'South London reared' youngster, my idea of heaven was a family holiday staying with my 'much better off' aunt and uncle who had moved to live on the Sussex coast and, when it was all over and I started moaning, my late mother would always say, 'But isn't it so lovely to be home?' Rather ungratefully, I would think 'No, it isn't!'

Reminiscing with family recently, we recalled the wedding just over 5 years ago of my nephew at a church near Ilford. The service was a stunning and moving Nuptial Mass in their Roman Catholic church and I was privileged to be asked to preach and my son to sing. However, on the way there we became gridlocked in an awful traffic jam and had little time to 'take-in' the hotel we had been booked into. At around midnight after a super reception for about 200 people we began our walk back to the hotel and, probably fortified by the fruit of the vine, bravely endeavoured to break up a couple having a nasty scuffle (not guests!) on the pavement – fortunately the police soon arriving to take over. As we arrived at the hotel we realised we needed to make our way past huge bouncers and numerous 'oikish' individuals making their way into a nightclub over which we realised our accommodation was located! Our over-heated rooms pounded from the sound beneath until 3am!

Attending Mass at the same church in the morning, we all then partook of a 'just passable' Sunday lunch in a horrid local pub (so unlike our super Fox and Bell)

before setting off for Kent. We had woken – if we had slept – to 3 inches of 'beginning of April' snow and as we arrived back in the county so it arrived here with some vengeance. It was an unpleasant and tiring journey and, as my mother would have agreed, 'It was so lovely to be home!'

For the last 3 years of his earthly life it seems that, whilst Jesus had no particular home, it is clear that the times he shared in the home of the special friends he loved (Mary, Martha and Lazarus) were so important to him as he 'made his home with them'.

Jesus said (John 14:23) 'Those who love me will keep, my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them'. The TV bombards us with images of beautiful homes, but to my mind the best homes are simply places of security where love is offered and shared, and especially so when the commitment of our time and energy to create such a home makes room for the fulfilment of Jesus' promise to dwell with us.



Village Folk

Peregrine Falcons, Harris Hawk, Merlin, Owls..... This month, you would be forgiven for thinking that I had stepped way outside Temple Ewell into perhaps Wingham Wildlife Park or Howletts Zoo. No, remarkably these species and more can be found at the centre of our village and are ably cared for by this month's guest, Conan Taylor.



Conan (known as Con) has lived within our midst for the past 14 years. From a young age he has always had a collection of pets and birds of prey, and brought them all here with him when he moved to the village. I will reveal the majority of his charges later but let me start by giving you some background information.

Born in Bunkers Hill, Dover 52 years ago, his mum was an avid Conan Doyle fan (author of the Sherlock Holmes tales) - hence the rather unusual name. He has one brother and two sisters, all of whom still live locally. His father is an avid naturalist plus wildlife artist. When Conan was young, he was always so happy and excited to tag along with his father when he went bird watching or for long nature rambles, usually returning with an addition to his pet collection of snakes and frogs etc. As a youngster, he fondly recalls once catching several trout in the stream under the bridge in Temple Ewell, which the family then had for tea.

Having attended Temple Ewell Primary School for a year, he then transferred to the newly built Whitfield Primary and subsequently to Archers Court Secondary School where he left at age 16. As both his parents were farm workers, it seemed only natural that Conan's first job would also be in farming and so he was employed as a pig man at Watersend Farm. He left after two years to train as a trawlerman working from the port at Ramsgate and trawling for sea bass. He mainly went out daily, fishing from dawn to dusk and occasionally the crew would be at sea for as many as three days with a cargo hold half full of ice. They fished the Thames Estuary or Goodwin Sands where he was once rescued after his fishing vessel sprung a leak. With the nearest rescue vessel some 10 miles away, the situation became more urgent after the captain injured himself while trying to repair the hole and the boat was filling up fast with water. Fortunately however, a training helicopter crew heard the distress call on their radio and managed to locate them. They were then able to direct the rescue boat to the scene - by which time the fishing vessel had all but disappeared under water. A real close call.

After some six years, Conan transferred to the Harbour Board where after passing the relevant courses, he qualified as a Mate. He has been working there for some 20 years now and his tug boat duties include steering cargo ships, ferries and cruise ships into the Port of Dover.

Conan met his lovely (and very understanding..) wife Fran while she was out riding in a field in Whitfield and Conan was in search of one of his hawks who had suddenly flown out of his car. They have lived happily here together in the village for the last 14 years and thankfully, Fran is also an avid animal lover (not much option really). They have five children - all living nearby - one of whom is studying in Liverpool to become a vet. Has to be something in the blood.

I will try to recount the various birds and pets I saw when I visited their home. 2 Peregrine Falcons, 1 Merlin, 1 Perlin (half Merlin half Peregrine), an absolutely adorable Little Owl called Douglas, a Harris Hawk, 4 pairs of canaries, 3 pointer dogs, a Jack Russell, 3 horses (Fran's) and (currently) 5 ferrets. Whew - feeding time must take an age.



Conan has given demonstrations for some charity shows in the past but prefers that the birds of prey are left to do what comes naturally to them. Consequently, he attends sessions all over the country and never ceases to be amazed at the power and technical ability of the birds in flight - especially when hunting. He takes them out to exercise every day of the hawking season.

To date, he has bred three litters of pointers and has successfully managed to breed a Merlin and a Perlin which gave a brood of chicks which were 3/4 Merlin and 1/4 Perlin - the only known combination ever successfully bred in the world.

My thanks to both Conan and Fran for their hospitality and permitting me to have a glimpse of their large and unusual collection of animals.

Temple Ewell Parish Council

Broken Street Light – Lower Road – KHS has failed to mend a broken light after being informed on numerous occasions over a seven month period, therefore the Parish Councillors have no alternative but to escalated this issue and a send a letter of concern to John Burr the Director of Kent Highways.

Lamp post Dragon Wood Car Park – The Clerk has written to Keith Watson, DDC and provided copies of correspondence regarding the Temple Ewell lighting column located in the main village car park from 2004. The correspondence confirms that an agreement was made for the lighting to be maintained & serviced by DDC at the time of the George & Dragon development. Awaiting a reply.

The vacant allotments have been filled. Eight plots have been rotovated to make planting easier at the beginning of the season. In the past new tenants often have a difficult time of transforming plots on derelict sites into flourishing allotments. It is hoped that this will also help to reduce the turnover of allotment holders.

KCC Termination of Licence for Use of Parish Council's Playing Fields – Andrew White, KCC wrote to the Parish Council informing them that Temple Ewell CE Primary School will be converting to an Academy on 1st June 2013. The School will be maintained by an Academy Trust, who in this instance will be the Canterbury Diocesan Board of Education. The County Council will therefore have no need for the benefit of the licence with effect from 1st June 2013. In accordance with Item 2 (a) of the licence agreement, received on 15th February 2010, six month's notice needs to be served to terminate the Licence and Mr White has asked for an indication as to whether the Parish Council would accept the County Council's licence to be deemed as terminated with effect from 1st June 2013, or six months after the date of this e-mail, i.e. 4th October 2013. The Parish Councillors agreed to consider a new licence on the same terms at their next meeting on 28th May 2013. Clarification is also required for the 2013/14 payment details e.g Full year paid by the academy or pro rata with KCC.

The Dover Society are taking a leading role in the River Dour Steering Group where, despite cuts in funding, monthly litter clearances continue enabled, at least for one more year, by financial assistance primarily from DTC. To assist grant applications for funding they have agreed that this Group should come under the Society's 'umbrella' as a registered charity. TDS are keen to work with the University of Kent, encouraging students to visit the River Dour for field trips.

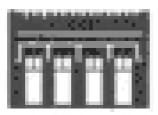
