Councillor Geoffery Lymer

Well after a very wet April we do not seem to be looking at a very promising May weather wise, though there is a glimmer of hope for June if the weather forecasting is to be believed.

This month I would like to broach the concerns that some grand parents ask me for advice on and that is to do with their grand children and their rights to access in the event of a family break



up. It is often a tense time when your son or daughter is going through a divorce or separation, then there is the question or dispute about any future contact with your grandchildren. Quite often grand parents can find themselves being denied contact by their own children where their relationship breaks down.

Under the current legal framework grand parents may have few rights of redress. The courts can decree what contact should be with people involved in the child's life or where they can reside, grandparents unfortunately do not fall into this category. As a result grandparents would have to apply for permission to make their own application to establish "contact rights." As to whether their application could be granted could depend on factors such as the nature of the application that the grand parents would want to make and would there be a risk of interrupting the child's life to a point where it could be deemed disruptive. Though very few grand parents are refused permission.

There are currently discussions ongoing that could lead to legislation being formulated making one of the biggest changes to generations of family law. This would be known as "presumptive shared parenting." Effectively the legislation would provide men with shared or equal access to their children when a relationship ends. This would make it much easier for grandparents to maintain contact with their grandchildren when parents separate, the problem normally affecting those on the father's side.

A willingness to mediate or negotiate will help ensure access disputes remain away from the court rooms by ensuring that a child's best interests are met by continued access to loved ones.



Her two children and her grandchildren all live within the immediate area and Jenny adores spending time with them. Her circle of friends is, as you may well imagine, large too. She recently entertained some friends who came to stay with her, that she has known since she was 4 years old.

<u>Travel</u>: Mainly in the UK, Europe and Canada, when time permits. Jenny particularly loves meeting up with her two sisters in London for the day to explore the many interesting facets of our capital city.

The one overwhelming impression you are left with about Jenny is how enthusiastic she is for the strong community within Temple Ewell. No matter where in the world she goes, she is always immensely happy to return home here. Her untiring and unswerving involvement in the local community has most certainly helped many of us feel exactly the same joy at living in such a close, happy and supportive community.

Temple Ewell Parish Council Meeting 24th April 2012

Her Majesty The Queen's Diamond Jubilee:

A network of over 4000 Beacons will be lit by communities and others throughout the United Kingdom, Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, along with the Commonwealth and UK Overseas Territories on Monday 4th June 2012 to celebrate Her Majesty The Queen's Diamond Jubilee.

Come and join a fun family evening at King George V Playing Field culminating in the lighting of Temple Ewell's Beacon at 10.15pm.

Digital Switchover Reminder:

1.7 MILLION VIEWERS PREPARE TO SWITCH

There are just two weeks to go until the first stage of switchover on 30 May for viewers across East Sussex and South West Kent watching TV from the Heathfield, Hastings or Tunbridge Wells transmitters. Viewers across most of Kent and parts of East Sussex who receive TV from the Dover or Bluebell Hill transmitters will begin to switch on 13 June – you can check when you are due to switch on the Digital UK website.

Village Rubbish – Roger Walton, DDC, Director of Environment and Corporate Assets replied to the Parish Councils concerns regarding Veolia Waste Collection Services. He explained that his general impression was that standards have improved over recent weeks. Clearly the failure to clear litter dropped during the course of collections is not acceptable and he will highlight this to their contractor. As regards to paper blowing out of their boxes, individual householders can help by placing their food bins on top of the paper or indeed packing paper in the box in such a way as to minimise the problem. DDC has given careful consideration to the need to provide lids but evidence from other Districts is that these can be just as much a nuisance when they blow around too.

Veolia Water Company – Tony Whitehouse wrote to the Parish Council following a visit to the Leat where he witnessed evidence of bonfires and elements of fly tipping and general debris on the Brookside Bank. The condition of the area raises concerns for undermining of the bank and resulting obstructions/blockages in the Leat. The Chairman and Cllr R Marsden agreed to meet with Mr Whitehouse to discuss this issue and will report back at the next meeting.

Dragon Wood – Queen Elizabeth 11 Fields Challenge – The Clerk provided further information for the Parish Councillors for consideration regarding the scheme. After much debate it was proposed that Terry Housden, Regional Manager, The Queen Elizabeth II Fields Challenge be asked to inspect the site and provide a report. If this is acceptable then the Parish Council should pursue a Deed of Dedication. Three Parish Councillors were in favour, three abstained.

Parishioners are encouraged to report any incidents within the village to PCSO Stevens on 0777 222 6209 or to go to the PCSO's monthly surgery. For immediate help contact Dover Police on 01304 240055 or dial 999.
