Marking the 100 years since the outbreak of the First World War, throughout August in towns and villages like ours across the country there will be many acts of solemn remembrance. The close of the last century saw the end of the most violent and destructive century in history with conflict and war of disastrous proportion. With sorrow we sadly also recognise the conflicts, the terrorism, the fears, pain and loss of just 14 years into the new century.

The First World War poems of the Revd. Studdert-Kennedy (Woodbine Willie) were to move the hearts of thousands. His 'Rough Rhymes of a Padre' (published later as 'The Unutterable Beauty') were said to 'speak for the soldiers the words they

tried to say and made the truth known' and indeed his angry and despairing verses from 'Waste' still ring true...

'Waste of Muscle, Waste of Brain Waste of Patience, waste of Pain, Waste of Manhood, waste of Health Waste of Beauty, waste of Wealth

Waste of Blood, and waste of Tears Waste of Youth's most precious years, Waste of ways the saints have trod Waste of Glory, waste of God.....WAR!!'

As we commemorate the outbreak of a war of such awful and colossal loss, any glorification would be an obscenity. Yet to only speak in terms of waste is surely equally wrong and offensive, because we are remembering those who made for us the greatest sacrifice it is possible to make, and that sacrifice has a special claim on the remembrance of us all. To remember the departed is, in itself, an act of love, just as to forget them is a failure of love.

For many Christian people, our belief is that to remember the departed in prayer is to bring our act of love into union with God's love for them, and more still, it is an affirmation of our recognition that we are still in communion with them — an inevitable, but true and real communion within a mystical fellowship which death does not and cannot destroy. For the spiritual Christ embraces and holds them, with us, in one communion and bond of love that cannot be broken, and here is expressed our belief, our hope, our prayer.

Harry Patch of 'The Last Tommy' fame was said to have been overwhelmed by such a status and, in fact, it often reduced him to silent contemplation. I think he would have approved of this August's rightful commemoration beginning with a time of similar silence and at the Church of St. Peter & St. Paul, Temple Ewell at 11.00 a.m. and at the Church of St. Mary the Virgin, Lydden at 12 noon, on Monday 4th August all who are able to come are welcome to share a short period of stillness, a reading and prayer.

THE THIRD LAYER

I feel incensed when I read of some punishments which are imposed by our Courts. "Haven't they heard that the punishment should fit the crime", I fume. "Where is the justice in that", I expostulate! Justice should be receiving the due penalty for the offence.

If I am the offender I may view things very differently, I would expect a just penalty but I would hope for mercy. A second layer to be applied in addition to the justice. Mercy is not being given the punishment we deserve. In "The Merchant of Venice" William Shakespeare expresses it as "mercy seasons justice".

The first layer is JUSTICE. the second layer is MERCY. There is a third layer where the miscreant expects justice, hopes for mercy but also becomes the unexpected recipient of undeserved favour. The third layer is GRACE.



KCC and DDC Councillor



Well at last as we head towards the longest day of the year it looks as though Summer has arrived at last, just in time for the start of the holiday season.

We have just had the Euro elections where I should imagine many politicians were shocked because they were voted in when they may have thought they would not have had a chance and there would have been other politicians who may have

thought that they would be re elected and were not. All of us voted by attending voting booths or by using a postal votes. The details of the voters would have been obtained using the electoral roll, as it had done for decades.

This is all going to change from June 2014, when we move to what is called IER. This is an acronym for Individual Electoral Registration.

So how will it work, what will change and when? Some anticipated questions concerning IER, finally where to find out more information:

IER will operate instead of using the electoral register to secure your voting rights, everyone will take responsibility for their own registration. In order to apply, a person will need to provide their National Insurance number and date of birth, these details will be used to verify the intended voter is who they say they are and hopefully, reduce the risk of blatant fraud and inaccurate entries on the register, as has been found in certain parts of the country. For the first time people will be able to register online. IER will be introduced in England and Wales on the 10 June 2014.

So what happens if an elector does not apply to register? Those who voted in 2013/14 will be automatically carried forward to IER but will lose their ability to vote by post or proxy.

Can electors still use postal and proxy vote? Anyone wishing to vote in 2015, will have to be registered under IER.

Will overseas voters be able to register with IER? Yes, all eligible British Subjects living overseas are encouraged to register to vote.

I am sure some of you may have other questions or concerns. If you do please visit the IER website. To obtain more information log on to www.gov.uk/register-to-vote.

Remember what ever political party you support, your vote matters to that party.

Dog Control – The Fouling of Land by Dogs (DDC) Order 2014

There are large areas in the District which are not covered by this

legislation. The proposed order will cover all land within the Dover

District Council area which is open to the air. This includes land that is covered but open to the air on at least one side and to which the public are entitled or permitted to have access with or without payment.

The Dogs on Leads by Direction (DDC) Order 2014

Again this will cover the whole District as detailed above. It will make it an offence not to put, and keep, dogs on leads when instructed to do so by an authorised officer. This would be used in instances where restraint is reasonably necessary to prevent a nuisance or behaviour by the dog likely to cause annoyance or disturbance to any person or the worrying or disturbance of any animal or bird.

The Dogs on Lead (DDC) Order 2014

This order shall require dogs to be kept on a lead in a number of areas throughout the District. This will mainly apply to enclosed areas like churchyards but will also replace some by-laws such as the seafront promenade from Deal Castle to Sandown Castle.

The Dogs Exclusion (DDC) Order 2014

This order shall ban dogs from certain areas. It will apply mainly to enclosed children's play areas, some churchyards and seasonally on some beaches.

The Parish Council will recommend to DDC that the King George V field be included in the Dogs Exclusion Order.

Dragon Wood The renovation of Dragon Wood has started. The Lower, middle & top steps leading from the car park and the 50 meter path has been refurbished. The Deed of Dedication plaque, oak benches, notice board, forest rubbish bin and new tools are on order.

Village Signage There are no plans for the historic village sign to be refurbished, due to budget restrictions. The Clerk will apply to Dist Cllr Lymer for grant funding.

PCSO May's Report Speed watch does not stop speeding but is very effective in slowing the majority of traffic. Three volunteers are required to man the board-mounted device each time it is used. Data is passed onto KCC of the offending vehicles and the police send a warning letter. The equipment costs £1,950 + vat. The Clerk has been informed that there may be grant funding opportunities available to purchase the device and will speak to Shepherdswell Parish Council who has already purchased a camera. PCSO May suggested that the Parish Council consider inviting Guy Rollinson, Kent Police Speedwatch Co-ordinator to a future meeting, who will be able to provide an overview.

Memorial Flower Bed

Villagers may have noticed that the Parish Council has commissioned a new flower bed at Players' Corner (at the bottom of Temple Side). The bed has been planted with scarlet geraniums and has a black marble centre with the inscription "Lest we forget".

As the summer progresses and the geraniums come into full bloom it is hoped that the bed will mirror the Royal British Legion Poppy of Remembrance in time for the centenary of the start of World War 1 in August.

In time, perhaps residents may like to place a cross at the memorial bed in memory of a loved one lost in conflict - not just the First World War, but any conflict, as the Poppy of Remembrance makes no distinction. The new flower bed may be more accessible to the less mobile members of our community.

In addition to the new flower bed, the Parish Council is also arranging for the War Memorial in the churchyard to be cleaned and refurbished in time for the centenary. Arrangements for events to mark the centenary (including the rededication of the war memorial and the dedication of the flower bed) will be publicised in the Newsletter.

The full Parish Council meets on the last Tuesday of the month (excluding August & December) at 7.15pm at the Temple Ewell Baptist Church Hall on the corner of the High Street and London Road. Parishioners are most welcome to attend and contribute to meetings.

The agenda and minutes are displayed on the Parish Council notice board by the village shop, Southdown Stores, and on the Parish Council website.

Village Folk

You know how I like to surprise you with my "finds" in the village?? Well, bet loads of you didn't know we had an ex professional footballer in our midst. I found him for you in the form of **Dominic Castle**.

You may recall last year's Village Folk article on his lovely wife Le'arna so Dominic is the other half of the act and an interesting story he has to tell too.



The tale starts way back in Orsett, Essex where Dominic was born in 1967 to a French mother and Londoner father. Both parents worked as care home professionals and their jobs took them temporarily to France (where Dominic was christened), eventually returning in 1973 to work for KCC.

Dominic attended Stella Maris Primary School in Folkestone then St Edmund's School in Dover where he left in 1983 having acquired 6 'O' levels, 2 'A' levels, plus a massive love of sport - particularly cricket and football.

He spent 2 years in his first job with Shepway District Council as a building maintenance clerk, then joined BHS's head office in Marylebone Road, London as a buyer - buying stock from all over the world to supply their UK stores.

After 2 years, Dominic answered a recruitment drive from TML for workers required in connection with building the Channel Tunnel. He was offered a position as a logistics programmer which involved stock control for various parts of the building project, ensuring that stock and supplies were available when needed, and delivered.

Despite his busy working life, he still managed to play football as often as he could and had many friends who also played at all levels of the game. One such friend was Russell Milton who played professional football for Arsenal and was subsequently transferred in 1990 to a team in Hong Kong called Double Flower (being the literal translation of the team's motif of a double flower!!). The team was looking for a striker for one season only and Russell recommended Dominic who - not surprisingly - hopped on the first available plane to Hong Kong for a trial.

He was signed up immediately and had an heroic debut match scoring for his new club in a stadium containing some 25,000 supporters. Dominic's time with the club was one of the most fascinating of his life as he played away games in Indonesia, Singapore, China and Malaysia. He recalls with some poignancy the time he played in the Indonesian city of Banda Aceh which some of you may recall was hit so tragically by a tsunami on Boxing Day 2004.

Back to the UK he went in 1991 where he resumed his position with TML (who had

kindly kept his job open for him). When the Tunnel project completed, he was offered a job by Balfour Beatty Power in their stores - effectively doing exactly what he had been doing for TML. Never one to let the grass grow under his feet, two years later he jumped at the chance of training to become a train driver with Le Shuttle and this is where he stayed happily for many years. This would prove to be a pivotal move as during training, he met Le'arna and they subsequently married and moved to their much loved cottage home in Lower Road, Temple Ewell.

In 2005, both Dominic and Le'arna accepted redundancy from Eurotunnel which enabled Le'arna to concentrate on her now successful singing career, and Dominic on his sporting career. Unfortunately, having broken his leg several years earlier, his professional footballing career had been shortened but his love of the game never diminished. He continued to play semi professional football with various clubs in the region, plus cricket for Folkestone.

He also enjoyed voluntarily assisting with football coaching of the youth teams which he found increasingly challenging and made the decision to concentrate his career on this aspect. He therefore started studying to obtain the necessary qualifications and volunteered to assist at Temple Ewell Primary School in order to ascertain how the education system worked.

Having achieved success with the first part of his course, he was offered a job with Arsenal Football Club as a Community Football Officer for South-East Kent & Sussex, having a staff of 48 under him. As a lifelong fan of the club, this is what he described as his dream job.

Continued exam success followed and through hard work and determination, Dominic finally achieved Grade A; the highest qualification in football coaching. In addition, last year he qualified at Canterbury Christchurch University, gaining a teaching Q+ status.

Having launched his own company - Active Community Development - he is currently contracted to work at several schools in the county. He has developed a structured regime for children which includes not just sporting activities but also ways of using sport to develop and advance neural pathways. To us lay-folk, this includes hand / eye co-ordination, decision making skills etc. with the aim of making children as co-ordinated as possible and installing more confidence in their abilities. On open days at the schools, he gives presentations to parents showing them how they can help advance their children with constructive issues through play.

Looking to the future, Dominic intends to continue to develop and hone his training techniques by keeping abreast of latest advancements and teaching methods. He loves living in the village and says he could not imagine being happier anywhere else. A proud statement that is shared by many of us.





What I can tell you, having been Parish Clerk for ten years, is that Kearsney Avenue is in the electoral parish of Temple Ewell - all that side of London Road, up as far as Whitfield Hill (and the houses half way up) is included in that. The other side of London

Road is classed as River, from the turning down to the Abbey opposite the Railway Bell in the Dover direction.

However, I think from the old church parish point of view Kearsney Avenue is still classed as River, which is probably why you get the Rivall delivered.
