Some notable dates in June include the 70th anniversary of the D-Day landings on 6th June 1944. This was when the Allied Forces of Britain, America, Canada, and France attacked German forces on the coast of Normandy, France. With a huge force of over 150,000 soldiers, the Allies attacked and gained a victory that became the turning point for World War II in Europe. This famous battle is also called the Invasion of Normandy and by the end of D-Day over 150,000 troops had landed in Normandy. They pushed their way inland allowing more troops to land over the next several days. By June 17th over half a million Allied troops had arrived and they began to push the Germans out of France.

15th June

London celebrates The Queen's official birthday on 14th June each year with Trooping the Colour, a fantastic military parade that has taken place since 1820. Trooping the Colour is an annual event that takes place on Horse Guards Parade in London's St James's Park. The ceremony is full of military pomp and pageantry as The Queen carries out an inspection of the troops from the Household Division. She then leads the troops down the Mall to Buckingham Palace. The Queen salutes and guns are fired in Green Park and at the Tower of London. Finally she joins other members of the Royal Family on the balcony to watch the RAF flypast.

In the Gregorian calendar the June solstice dates vary. For example, it occurs on June 21 in 2014 and 2015 but on June 20 in 2016. A June 22 solstice will not occur until June 22, 2203. The last time there was a June 22 solstice was in 1971. A solstice occurs when the sun's zenith is at its furthest point from the equator. During the June solstice it reaches its northernmost point and the Earth's North Pole tilts directly towards the sun, at about 23.5 degrees. It is also known as the northern solstice because it occurs when the sun is directly over the Tropic of Cancer in the northern hemisphere. If the Earth's rotation was at right angles to the plane of its orbit around the sun, there would be no solstice days and no seasons.

Even with top actors playing the leading roles, fans of the marvellous TV series 'Dad's Army' will be wondering if it is going to be possible to successfully recreate, as proposed, a new series (or was it maybe a film?). Could anyone but the late Clive Dunn as Corporal Jones, while panicking himself, bid the intrepid men of Walmington-on-Sea Home Guard 'Don't panic!' as he did? We shall have to wait and see.

'Don't panic' is something the Temple Ewell Parochial Church Council (PCC) is wanting to say to residents of both Temple Ewell and Lydden (also Guston), whose properties might well be affected by something called Chancel Repair Liability (CRL), but relating only to the repairs of the chancel of Temple Ewell Church. CRL is an historic liability affecting a number of property owners (and owners of agricultural land and institutions) in England and Wales to fund repairs to the chancel of local Anglican Parish Churches. Unfortunately, there have, and continue to be, some high profile cases where implementation of the liability has caused or may potentially cause considerable financial hardship.

Last year the cost of running and maintaining SS. Peter & Paul Temple Ewell including ministry costs was in excess of £44,000 with nearly £31,000 of this (and rising!) having to be paid directly to the Diocese as a 'Parish Share'. Like so many other churches, how long we can keep going and what will happen to our beloved church if we cannot, - well, I would rather not go there just now. Crucial is the continued very generous giving of our congregation, donations, constant fund-raising, the wonderful support of maintaining the fabric of the Church which we always receive on Gift Day and the kind of legacies we have been so thankful for in the past. However, whilst it will be seen that we have much to concern us, the Temple Ewell PCC has made a decision concerning CRL which we hope will ease any worries of affected home-owners in both Temple Ewell and Lydden.

When people have faithfully dedicated so much time and effort into maintaining the life and witness of their Parish Church, there can always be the unpleasant individuals who wish to undermine and belittle peoples' faith. I have in mind a resident in a Shropshire Parish where the situation over CRL is reported to be acrimonious and who objected to 'Having to pay.....for the upkeep of a building where an imaginary sky wizard is worshipped'. Fortunately, I have rarely met this kind of nastiness in Temple Ewell and Lydden, and if I did, I confess it would be a little tempting indeed to re-register their property. However, the decision formally taken by Temple Ewell PCC as trustees, and taking into account all relevant factors in accordance with Charity Commission guidance, was that CRL should not be registered with the Land Registry (as was required by 13.10.2013). Therefore, CRL WILL NOT be enforced and will also lapse automatically on any properties subsequently sold after the same date.

I do hope this assurance will be helpful to anyone with concerns about Chancel Repair Liability and their property.





Just when I thought we were entering warmer months and summer, suddenly we are reminded by the wet windy days recently that we are not quite there yet for summer.

As we approach those summer months we spend more time outdoors working in the garden, doing DIY, cycling and that can be when the inevitable accident happens. Now you may need medical help fast, but is it an emergency? How do you assess this? A deep cut to your finger, yes it looks bad and it may be bleeding profusely, but you have to ask yourself, what are the chances of this killing me? Very slim, then you should use the NHS 111 service, if you need medical help fast as in the above incident, but it's not a life-threatening incident then please do not use 999, for this will save diverting valuable resources from those life-threatening incidents, such as cardiac arrest and serious road traffic injuries. However if you think you should go to A&E, then phone 111 so that a quick assessment can be made to corroborate your thoughts, or to be given advice or guidance regarding your concern. This applies if you don't know who to call for medical help and you don't have a GP to call or you need health information.

For less urgent health issues you should contact your GP or local pharmacist. However, if a health professional has given you a specific phone number then you should continue to use that number. Why should you use NHS111? It's fast and simple to get the right help for you at any time where ever you are. Your considerate use of 111 will help free up the 999 and A&E services. Remember the 111 service is 24/7 365/366 days a year. It's free irrespective whether it is from a mobile or land line.

The Royal Mail raised the postage prices on the 31st March. A first class stamp increases 2p to 62p; a second class increases 3p to 53p. Large letters under 100g rising from 90 to 93p and over 100g from 69 to 73p.

Subject to a consultation the Government plans to replace our current £1 coin due to the vast number of Bermondsey and other forgeries still in circulation. The new coin will probably resemble the £2 coin but on a smaller diameter. The percentage of forged £1 coins believed to be still in circulation could be as high as 6%.

For those of you who own and use a classic vehicle, they used to be road tax exempt up to December 1973. This has now been moved to December 1974 on a rolling basis so next year, cars up to 1975 will be tax exempt.

The adult national minimum wage will increase by 3% to £6.50 from October 2014 and by 2% for youth and apprentices. The income tax personal allowance which reached £10,000 this April is set to rise to £10500 by April 2015.

From 1 April 2014 a council tax break applied to households that include a granny annexe or flat, if it is used by the occupiers of the main property or by their immediate family members including parents and teenagers. The council tax levied on an annexe will receive a 50% discount.
