

DEBT

As the General Election approaches, we have had weeks of discussion on the national economy. Some points appear to be obvious: What is spent by a Government has to be paid by taxes. Taxes can only be paid by those who have resources. The more people you have with resources then the greater amount of tax can be raised. If you borrow money then at some point it will need to be repaid and it will cost you interest until repayment is made. The Greek Government appears to be a slow learner. It is tempting to go into politics when it is so easy!

In his play Hamlet, William Shakespeare wrote the lines "Neither a borrower nor a lender be." This may be good advice but it is difficult to put into practice in our personal finances, particularly if you wish to purchase a house and obtaining a mortgage is the only option. The real horror is in having a loan which we know we can never repay.

We not only have financial debt but also spiritual debt. Wrongs which we have done which time does not erase. No matter how hard we try to balance the books by doing something positive we are not able to make amends. The good news in John's Gospel is that there is a debt payer available in God's only begotten son, Jesus Christ.

DODS Mill

Those of you who live in Mill Street will have been aware of work taking place at DODS Mill over the last two years, with skips and containers appearing and disappearing and frequent deliveries of timber and building materials. Finally on Friday 27th March DODS Mill was officially re-opened by Councillor Sue Nicholas, DDC Chairman following almost two years of hard work to bring it up to the required safety standards along with major internal refurbishment. The extent of the work required gave us no option but to completely close the Mill for use, the only area able to continue, albeit in a very limited way, was the costume department.

Following various bequests over the years we were fortunate to be able to start with a reasonably healthy bank balance which was added to with donations from a few of our current members. In addition we put on a concert version 'Hear the People Sing' which raised £500 and received another £500 from the Sergeant's Mess Pantomime in Deal. We also applied to the Roger De Haan Charitable Trust and were delighted when they granted us £15,000. We are extremely grateful to them for their most generous donation as it has enabled us to take the refurbishment a little further than we might have been able to. We are now starting a second round of fundraising to complete the refurbishment by paying attention to the outside of the Mill, particularly the roof.

And so to the nitty gritty, the work itself. Our building team was led by Dave Smith one of our members who was the driving force, designer, and project manager as well as an integral part of the work force with his professional carpentry skills amongst others. Dave drew up the original plans and specifications, liaised with Building Control and planned the order of works for what was technically a building site. Once all the plans were drawn, permissions granted and work started the use of trade professionals was kept to a minimum to help keep costs down but we are very grateful to Mark Groombridge, of Bridgemark Services for completing the huge amount of electrical work in a truly professional manner and John and Martin of John's Property Maintenance for their superb plaster work.

Over the twenty two months there were several days when teams of people were needed either to destroy, lift and shift, clean or paint and these were supported by some of our members. Literally everything else you see before you though has been done by a small nucleus of committed and dedicated people. Our wardrobe manager Trish Hadley spent countless hours sorting out the wardrobe department, de-cluttering, recycling and then putting everything that survived the cull back into place in a regimented and organised manner. Another member who not only gave great support but drove a 44 mile round trip to do so is our Technical Director Mark Goldsack.

The bulk of the work however was carried out by three retired DODS members Dave Smith, Mike Wadey and Ken Mennie who spent virtually every Monday and Tuesday over the 22 months working at the Mill. The staggering amount of

work that has been done is not immediately obvious such as replaced joists and making good in several areas. Every floor level has had new or replacement ceilings and every internal wall which isn't brick has been replaced, involving over 3500 plasterboard screws alone. On the top floor the whole layout was changed by moving both wardrobe department and kitchen. Add to the amount of work the fantastic quality of the finished product that has been achieved and we have very good reason to be extremely grateful to Dave, Mike and Ken. Altogether over 4400 man hours, the majority by them, have been spent on the work saving us well over £70,000 in labour costs.

We now have a beautiful, safe home to continue rehearsing in for many more years to come and it is now also available for hire as a social venue, rehearsal space or meeting point. We hope that many of you in the village will take advantage of this newly refurbished resource and there is a separate advert in this newsletter with details of the facilities available and how to book.





KCC and DDC Councillor

I have made a précis of what I believe the Care Act may mean to you now or at some possible stage in the future of your life.

The Care Act, which comes into being as from April 2015, means lots of different things for different people. It depends on your needs, but can include things like help to get out of bed, get dressed or washed, help with eating or cooking meals or caring

for others. Care and support comes from many different people, family and friends or members of the community. Central and County Government HELP to pay for SOME care and support, DEPENDING on your financial situation. The guidance states that Councils must give information and advice to everyone who wants it. This concerns the services that supply "well being" and what is important to people who use them.

Key changes expected in 2016 will be a cap on care costs being £72,000 for those who develop needs above 25 years, but free lifetime care if needs develop from early years to 25 years.

Change to Capital thresholds, extended means tests. £27,000 for people living at home and those in residential care whose home is disregarded. £118,000 for people in residential care (unless former home disregarded). The lower threshold is expected to be £17,000 (ie totally ignored).

From 2016 if a person wants to take advantage of the Care Cost Cap, they must have an assessment to determine WHAT AMOUNT should be used towards the cap. This will apply to new self funders AFTER this date AND ALSO existing funders -but the clock will only start ticking from April 2016. (IT WILL NOT BE RETROSPECTIVE).

Not all self funders will meet the national minimum eligibility criteria. Those in residential care, perhaps 10%, will not meet the criteria, HOWEVER, they may have been in care for a long time so a LIGHT TOUCH assessment will apply a proportionate response. For those in the community, a more in depth assessment is needed to test their eligibility and which emphasises (if realistic in the individual circumstances) what can be done to maximise independence, such as equipment and other aides to improve quality of life.

What is the eligibility criteria?

- 1) Needs arise from or related to a physical or mental impairment or illness.
- 2) Unable to achieve two or more specified outcomes.
- 3) Significant impact on well being as a consequence.

This actual piece of legislation extends to just over 1000 pages, so there will be many important areas to address specific issues in caring for an individual and equally important, for people like me, who also perform a role as a carer, to look after either the terminally ill, the severely disabled or frail ageing population, there can be assistance for the carer too.

The purpose of this article is to inform you of this new piece of legislation, because whilst reading it you may think "I'm aged 20,30,40 it does not affect me, I don't need to know about this," take it from me, it will impact upon everyone, at some stage in their life, from the healthy young motorcyclist who has a serious injury accident and losses a limb, to the person aged 30 who abuses drugs or alcohol and suffers mental illness or liver disease, to the person aged 40 who may be struck down with a stroke resulting in life long brain damage, to the 50 year old who may have early dementia or terminal cancer. May be you are the lucky one who evades such health issues, but then they may be a member of your family for whom you become the carer.

For further information if you visit the web site www.gov.uk//care-act-2014 there is also a "frequently asked questions for carers" www.carersuk.org which you may find useful.

Finally, I have been the District Councillor for Temple Ewell and Lydden since 2010 and, due to my heavy workloads as a County Councillor and performing a role as carer too I have decided to not stand for re-election on the 7 May 2015 elections. But I wish my successor well, from which ever political persuasion they may be aligned to, and, if only to say that at this level of politics, my view is that the politics should be consigned way into the background for it is all about the community and how we can maintain or improve the quality of life for the community. The role has been "interesting" to say the least and I shall continue in my role as a County Councillor in assisting and supporting which ever candidate is chosen by the majority of the community.
