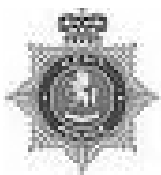

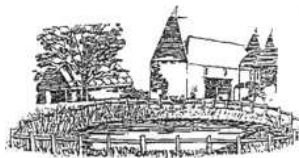

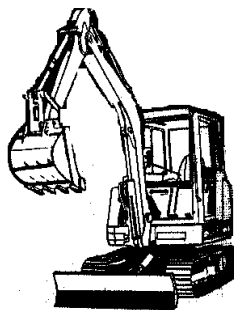

Whilst having accumulated far too many 'holy bits and pieces' over the years, I have often mentioned my disappointment for not purchasing from a second-hand shop a Victorian print of the Good Shepherd rescuing his lost sheep which is dangerously trapped in a crevasse on a steep and rocky hillside. The focus of the unknown artist is the hand of the Saviour with every sinew stretched to their limit whilst reaching down with incredible effort to the lost and petrified sheep. How much the artist managed to convey in that picture, but especially through that hand!

A small silver 'Praying Hands' worn by a friend recently reminded me of the story behind this much-loved image – the result of a moving relationship between two artists, the famous German Albrecht Durer (1471 -1528) and Franz Knigstein. It seems that, as students, the two tried to survive by working as part-time labourers but found this existence impossible. So they agreed to draw lots to decide which of them should find full-time work to support them both and to thus enable the 'winner' to devote himself entirely to his studies. Durer was the winner, but it was with the agreement that when his studies were complete, he would return in order that Knigstein could then complete his studies supported by Durer.

Durer indeed became very successful, but when at last he returned to fulfil his promise to Knigstein, sadly he found his friend's fingers had become so twisted and bent through hard manual labour that never would he be able to achieve the delicate control required of an artist's brush. In true friendship Knigstein

was not bitter, rather he was gratified to have been a part of Durer's success. In Durer's great masterpiece of the early Renaissance period 'The Praying Hands', the hands portrayed are those of his friend Knigstein. Durer had found him at prayer and Knigstein's hands had so spoken to him of his friend's love, faith and sacrifice that in gratitude he captured them as a perpetual tribute. It is a wonderful story, but maybe some of us in our lives also have special gratitude for another's sacrificial support to in some way express.

On Sunday 6th September in our beloved Church of St. Mary the Virgin, Lydden (10.30am) and two days before the day kept by the Church to celebrate her birthday, we have a special Patronal Festival Eucharist and a warm welcome awaits all. On this Sunday we give particular thanks to God for a wonderful lady and first among all the saints, the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of Our Lord, Mother of the Incarnate God. Far more than any other across the centuries, how many great artists have devoted their skills to express their gratitude to a lady to whom the Church proclaims we owe so very, very much!

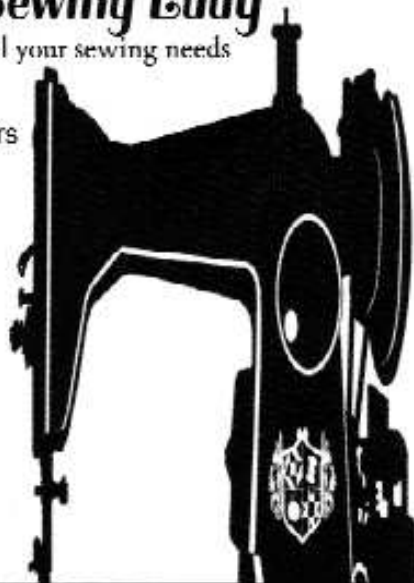

WIFI, 3K grants and twitter-to-woo - @LyddenTempleE – follow us and follow us all!

Dear residents of Lydden and Temple Ewell, I am delighted to have been elected as your new District Councillor and I will do all I can to help people within the ward areas. It is an honour to work and represent both villages and I have already met many interesting and supportive people. I have received many humbling emails of congratulations whilst currently doing the annual updating and training with the District Council legislation and my overall newly elected responsibilities. I have also been elected to sit on the Scrutiny Committee and Licencing alongside the lead for Health and Wellbeing.

The May Election itself was a resounding success with the South East receiving over 50% of the total votes, something which was apparent during the months of campaigning. I would like to say a huge thanks to our campaign teams, and the younger conservatives who put aside so much time and efforts to help in both the District and National campaigns.

As you may have seen from my previous candidate information during the election, I have held senior roles within the music and media industries mainly dealing with finance, contracts, audits, A&R, production, facilities, PR, HR, buildings and staff compliance and business development, business partnerships and digital strategic change. There are also one off £3000 broadband installation grants for broadband available for Kent businesses – see the above village twitter account for more info.

I would love to hear your thoughts on a desire for both villages to start up a plantshare/swap scheme? Perhaps we can all get together one day and make some great planters and wall baskets for the benefits of the elderly residents, house fronts, steps/doors and paved areas? We may even get some free materials or funding for this if it looks popular. The intention is too brighten up both villages including the Village Hall frontage and the local bus stop shelters. I suspect the impact might just slow down some of the traffic racing though?

Faster Broadband/WIFI campaign

Let's all start registering every telephone number and thus every household by default in both villages which will create a demand on their inner BT system. Can all residents take a few minutes online at home or at work to show BT et al the huge interest and need in faster broadband/WIFI by going to www.bt.com/infinity and entering your BT number in the checker on the right hand side along with your postcode for free.

The Aim of the Community Award Scheme is to acknowledge and give recognition to those that have made a significant contribution to their local community.

Parishioners of Temple Ewell nominated three individuals for their loyal and committed service to the village of Temple Ewell, Mrs M Holness, Mr B Newington and Mrs J Miles, who have all played an important role in making the community a better place to work, live and play.



The Parish Council Chairman presented a certificate signed by the KALC Chairman and the High Sheriff of Kent, with a bouquet of flowers to Mrs Miles. Two further certificates signed by the Parish Council, were presented to Mr Newington and Mrs Holness. The parish councillors extended their official thanks and gratitude to the nominees, in recognition for both their selfless dedication and the invaluable contribution they have made.

It has been brought to the Parish Council's attention that a number of dog owners have been allowing their dogs to roam freely on the King George V Playing Field. It appears that the signs clearly stating 'No Dogs Allowed' erected at both entrances of the playing field are being ignored.

Dogs, in themselves, are not a problem. It is the lack of control by a small minority of owners which causes problems. However this minority does present potential problems for our recreation ground and children's play. Dog fouling is unsightly and unpleasant. Apart from being an unpleasant nuisance if you step in it, fall in it, cycle through it, or wheel your wheelchair through it, dog mess can also be a serious health hazard. The presence of dogs in our play area can also deter young children and families from using the field. Steps have been taken to monitor dogs on the playing field and any breach of the bylaws could lead to a prosecution and fine.

The Parish Council would therefore like to remind parishioners that the King George V Playing Field is a **Dog Free Zone**.

The full Parish Council meets on the last Tuesday of the month (excluding August and December) at 7.15pm at the Temple Ewell Baptist Church Hall on the corner of the High Street and London Road.

Parishioners are most welcome to attend and contribute to meetings.

Volunteers have continued to help with the project, carrying out observational surveys, taking part in archaeological digs and looking through archives for interesting stories about the parks.

In the meantime - and as part of the HLF-funded Up on the Downs summer festival - there will be a Farm & Forest Day taking place in Russell Gardens on Friday 7 August from 10am to 4pm. Come along to meet a local sheep farmer and her sheep, see vintage farm vehicles, peruse farmers market stalls, take part in Forest School activities, help to knit bunting and watch model boats on the ornamental pond! We're expecting a busy day and parking is limited so please walk, cycle or take public transport if you can.

We will continue to keep you up to date with progress on the project but if you have any questions in the meantime please get in touch.

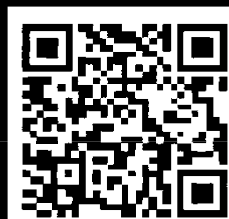

CHANNEL ROTARY CYCLE CHALLENGE

Undaunted, and after the appalling conditions of the previous Hospice Ride, we set off to the small but picturesque village of St Mary-in-the-Marsh. Channel Rotary's Annual Cycle Challenge around the Marsh gives the option of a 10 mile, 30 mile or 50 mile distance to raise funds for Kent Air Ambulance.

Having registered online we quickly got going, full of energy and enthusiasm! The route took us across to the Lathe Barn, Burmarsh and then on through many winding lanes and tracks. After 26 miles there was a refreshment stop at Ivychurch Village Hall where members of Channel Rotary provided us with delicious fruit cake, energy bars,

fresh fruit and drinks. Just after setting off on the last leg of the ride we had to stop to repair a puncture in a back wheel (the front is so much easier!). However, undaunted, we pushed on towards the western edge of the Marsh, in sight of Rye, and through the flourishing village of Appledore with his pretty tea rooms and craft shops. Directed by one of the many marshals on the route we now turned back towards St Mary-in-the-Marsh.

We were by now beginning to feel the effects of non-stop pedalling against a strong south westerly wind. The saddle was certainly making its presence felt and each church tower or spire disappointed as it proved not to be the St Mary's Church of our destination. Four hours after our energetic start we cycled relieved but smiling into The Crown pub greeted by a very loud hooter!! A very challenging ride was ended with the best Hot Dog ever!
