Our next meeting is on April 14th.







I wonder how many now remember the Church & Village LYTE magazine so faithfully produced for many years by Marian Middlebrook? Recently, I came across a folder with copies of several of the monthly letters I was required to write to LYTE readers. Nothing outstanding there, except that just glancing at one or two, I was taken aback by a 1992 letter which said, 'how encouraging it was that, after the Palm Sunday procession through Temple Ewell, over 100 people then packed the Church for the Parish Eucharist!

If we study the scriptural accounts of the Resurrection, we find an element which I doubt would have appeared had the Christian faith been founded on no more than a dream, and that is the element of 'surprise'.

The Resurrection took everyone, including the apostles, by complete surprise. Rather than returning, as they began to do, to their old occupations with their broken dreams, most of the first apostles willingly sacrificed their lives through cruel martyrdom.

They were willing to do this because the risen Jesus had appeared to them and because as they came understand, their continued love and devotion to him called them to make known the redeeming love and transforming power of God, signified


by the cross of Jesus and by his empty tomb – that love and power reaching out, as it hopes to today, to heal and transform his children and his world.

It is with mixed emotion that I look back from how things are now in our land and think about that large Palm Sunday congregation of 1992. But I have a dear friend, now a Roman Catholic priest, whose reassuring words I have pondered several times, 'nothing is ever lost, everything is taken into eternity'.

The prayer of our Parish Churches is that the blessing and tremendous hope of Easter will surprise many more again for, for all 'God so loved the world that he gave his only Son'. John 3:16

I forget who said "Funeral services are of interest because there is more than an outside chance that I will take part in one." We try to minimise the loss by calling it "A celebration of the life of......". Both titles are applicable as we not only wish to express our grief at the passing of a loved one, but also to be thankful for their life. The added factor, which we don't like being reminded of, is that our own duration is limited. It is a time of personal reflection. This was brought home to me recently when I attended my first Humanist Funeral. The lady who took the service was very competent and dignified. The absence of any participation by the mourners did seem a pity. The life and considerable achievements of the deceased were fully amplified on both the career front and the ample grandchildren which had been produced. The past could not have been better expressed. There was not a word about the future! There was no element of hope!

It is obviously desirable that the past achievements should be fully acknowledged. It seemed to me such a tragedy that such an able and productive person would have nothing to look forward to. It caused me to think, as all such memorials should do. The importance of our life purpose and destiny are made evident at this time. My thoughts were turned to other services where the rich words are spoken "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die." (John's Gospel chapter 11).

This week marks the launch of 'One You', a ground-breaking new campaign to help adults across the country avoid future diseases caused by modern day life.

Everyday habits and behaviours - such as eating too much unhealthy food, drinking more than is recommended, continuing to smoke and not being active enough – are responsible for around 40% of all deaths in England, and cost the NHS more than £11 billion a year.

It is estimated that there are around 225,000 smokers in Kent (approximately 19% of the population) and almost 770,000 overweight and obese adults (65.1% of the local population). Figures also show that there were 24,833 alcohol related admissions in Kent in 2014/15 - a 25% increase in five years.

Kent County Council is supporting 'One You' which aims to encourage adults, particular those in middle age, to take control of their health to enjoy significant benefits now, and in later life.

Latest figures show that life expectancy at older ages is at record levels, yet many are spending their retirement living in ill health. Currently 15million Britons are living with a long-term health condition, yet studies show living healthily in middle age can double your chances of being healthy when you are 70.

The new campaign from Public Health England will help adults in Kent to move more, eat well, drink less and be smoke free. 'One You' will also provide information on how people can reduce their stress levels and sleep better.

It is encouraging adults to start by taking a new online health quiz, called 'How Are You'. This innovative quiz provides personalised recommendations based on your results and directs people to tools and advice to help them take action where it's most needed. Over half (56%) of 40-60 year olds taking the 'How Are You' quiz said they were likely to change their lifestyle to improve their health because of the feedback it gave them.

KCC Director of Public Health, Andrew Scott-Clark said: "We are supporting the 'One You' campaign because it reinforces the work already underway in the county to encourage people to reappraise their lifestyle choices, put themselves first and do something about their own health.

"It reminds people that it's never too late to improve their health - making small lifestyle changes such as eating well, drinking less alcohol, quitting smoking or being more active can double your chances of being healthy at 70 and beyond. We want people to put themselves first and do something about their own health before it's too late."

Professor Kevin Fenton, National Director of Public Health England said: "For the first time, Public Health England is launching a campaign that talks to adults directly about all of the things they can do to improve their health. The scale of the campaign is unprecendented and includes new public and commercial partnerships with Amazon, Asda, BBC Get Inspired, Slimming World and the Armed Forces.

"This will see One You in every community, on every high street, in local health services, on websites and in social media. We want everyone across the country to know that it is never too late to get your health back on track."


