THE DOVER EXPRESS AND EAST KENT NEWS FRIDAY 22 August 1952

Unpacking some of our Dad's 'bits and bobs' in his garage we came across some pages of the above newspaper. I thought you may be interested in some of the articles so here are a few brief snippets from the day of yore.......

'THE TEMPLE EWELL FLOWER SHOW –The Children took the Honours'

It was the children of the village who provided the outstanding features of the Temple Ewell, Lydden and District Produce Associations' flower show held at Temple Ewell on Saturday.

The fruit, vegetables and flower show, safely installed in the village school went on unhindered while the rain in the morning followed by more unsettled weather slowed down the business of the fete held in the newly-opened King George Playing Field. Some of the stalls were moved under cover but others carried on out on the grass.

The weather did not upset the fancy dress parade for which 32 entered to be judged by Mr C G Lines and Mrs B Coombe. The ingenuity shown by the children or whoever

designed their costumes was amazing but the results showed that it was not always the most elaborate get-ups that take the prizes. Scarecrow Roger Hardeman walked off with the first place dressed in a simple overlarge macintosh – making it difficult for him to walk in the march past - with straw hair and a broomstick for arms.

Second prize went to Frances Lee as an Elizabethan girl with Richard Hoskins (The Mad Hatter) third. Consolation prizes were awarded to: bath boy Eric Hoskins, Yvonne Stokes masquerading as an Indian boy and Tommy chapman as a rather grubby sweep.

The Horticultural show was opened by Mrs Lines, the wife of Mr G Lines, Chairman of the Rural District Council, who said that it was pleasant to see that the village was keeping alive the tradition of beautiful flowers which was an essential part of country life. It was unfortunate that so many of the inhabitants of the countryside were going to work in the towns but it was good to see that they were still interested in the social life of the villages.

Mrs Lines had been introduced by the Association's Chairman, Mr C D Young, who spoke of the gradual improvement of exhibits at the show from year to year. The flowers presented a great variety of colour and the fruit and vegetables were very good, but it was the children's exhibits which drew the biggest section of the several hundred who attended the show. The miniature gardens put in by the youngsters showed that they had schemed their colour systems well and the blending of these colours by David Hoskins (who took first prize in that class for up to 11 years of age) was beautiful. His brother Richard, who took second prize in the same class, was also very good. In the same section with the age limit at 15 years, Brian Mead presented another worthy exhibit. An attractive trading stall was exhibited by Messrs. Fisher and Goodburn alongside the children's produce stall, which added to the decoration of the room.

Mr O'Price kindly presented the prizes. The judges were Mr A J Andrews and Mrs S J Holmans who commented on the fine quality of the tomatoes. The cakes were judged by Mr Hughes and Mr Hammond and Mrs Whiteman judged the bottled fruit and jams.

Mrs Pollard won the Bowling for the Pig contest, which was in the charge of Mr Baker. Other side shows were Treasure Hunt, Dart and Driving the Nail.'
The article went on to name the competition winners.

Sadly they undoubtedly exist, but it would be a very hard person indeed who could watch Mel Gibson's 2004 film 'The Passion of the Christ' without feeling some emotion. Invariably for most, I think the emotion intensified during scenes that involved Mary, the Mother of Christ, as she struggled with the suffering of her Son – a struggle which was very apparent to us as we pondered the 'Way of the Cross' meditations during Lent and 'journeyed with Jesus' through the meaningful services of Holy Week. However, from Easter morning until Pentecost (recalling the empowering of the apostles with the gift of the Holy Spirit) there is a focus at the end of our services at Temple Ewell (also Lydden Easter Day) upon the absolute joy of the Holy Mother at the resurrection of her Son, and that focus is a short sung devotion called the 'Regina Coeli'. On Easter morning at Temple Ewell during the very joyful singing of this devotion, I know I was not the only one to notice that a butterfly (a symbol of the resurrection) was dancing at the foot if the Cross in the stained-glass window above the altar we were facing.

Symbols are very powerful things and they often relate at a very deep level in a way words can never do. Contrary to the fears of some, we do not worship symbols in church, rather they are used to lead us into deeper truths. In just the same way, occasionally people say that it is through nature that they are drawn to a kind of experience of God. We can, of course, fall into a trap of worshipping nature rather than God, but without doubt there is a reality and truth in this concept of God.

If God is everywhere, then we will surely expect to find him through our life together as his people, through the nature which speaks to us, and through our burdens

when we identify them closely with the symbol of the cross. All around us at the moment in this lovely part of Kent where we are blessed to live are signs of the new life which faithfully return through God's nature each year and especially bursts forth during the month traditionally known as 'Mary's Month of May'. The new life bursting forth from the egg, the butterfly from the 'tomb' of the chrysalis, and so on, are all signs embraced within Christianity to express the resurrection life and they are wonderful symbols. It seems that so many sad and on-going aspects of our world and society, our Church, and for some their personal burdens, are signs more of barrenness than of new life. But if we can identify the symbol of the cross right at the centre of them all, then we can still acknowledge God's faithful presence and trust, and hope and pray.

I love you Mum, we'll just have to be patient with each other while I grow up – to be.





Lydden hill signage is now being repaired by KCC. I am also grateful to Husks/Seaways for also working to report illegal parking. Thanks as well to Kent Police and Lydden residents for engaging and actively supporting this long needed action.

Over the Easter period I allocated two full days of my time to record and take pictures of the endless repairs required on both London and Canterbury Roads. I have now submitted a huge amount of reports, some of which works are slowly being attended to. I promise to chase them up. I also requested a full resurface for both road areas weeks ago. The condition of these roads is not acceptable, least of all to motorbikes or cyclists. I have also requested that all white lines and chevrons be replaced and that urgent repairs are done to the Temple Ewell central island, which has been left wrecked for six weeks now.

Finally, all bus stops, yellow lines and parking areas along the entire stretch have been reported as requiring attention and confirmation has been received that works are in hand.

On other note there have been unfounded rumours regarding the ceasing of bus routes. This is not true at any level I have been involved with - bus routes are NOT being discussed to be ceased.

I am delighted to report that Whitfield Hill has been tidied up. It now looks so much better ahead of the Queen's Birthday Celebrations. I have thanked Dover District Council for responding to my requests and prioritising this work.

KCC will be replacing hanging baskets wrongly removed by them at the top of High Street once the Parish Clerk has forwarded replacement costs to them.

You may be aware that the Police Commissioner Elections take place on May 5th following Ann Barnes standing down. I strongly urge you to consider supporting Mathew Scott who has supported a policy of intolerance towards illegal fly parking and drink driving with myself recently. See @scott4kent and @LyddenTempleE

Recent demands from myself, Council Leader Paul Watkins and Dover MP Charlie Elphicke have been submitted for the roadside and hedgerows, many of which are sadly full of non bio-degradable plastics, to be cleaned up. It is my view that Dover Port should also pay towards this as much of the litter is dumped by passing trade, EU transport and tourists. Dover should not suffer due to a lack of Port business' concerns from the relentless activity.

Thank you all for your kind support recently - I hear your views.

Together we will work to keep your environment maintained and your views heard.



Dear Editor

Scammers are devious criminals. Scam mail is aimed at tricking the recipients into sending money through bogus schemes, such as prize draws, fake lotteries and sweepstakes. Anybody can fall victim to these scams. The consequences of this heinous crime cause more than the loss of money. It takes away the victim's confidence and makes them feel lonely helpless and vulnerable.

Kent County Council Trading Standards receives intelligence telling us that Kent residents are being affected by scams: 3.2 million people fall victim to scams every year; It is estimated that £10 Billion a year is being sent to postal scams alone; Based on the mosaic profiling of the 1.4 million residents living in Kent, we now know that 42% are likely to be a scam victim, (up to 600,000 people); Scam mail is aimed at tricking recipients into sending money through bogus schemes, such as prize draws.

It's a vicious circle: Victims respond to a scam mailing. Their name is added to a 'suckers list' and sold to other scammers. The victim is repeatedly targeted with more scam mail and phone calls. This only stops when the victim runs out of money, dies or somebody intervenes.

Trading Standards is committed to supporting scam victims and have developed a long term support network for these vulnerable people to raise awareness of this devastating crime through the Stop the Scammers project. We can only achieve this by working with partners, such as Community Wardens, Kent Police and Royal Mail.
