We will be starting to collect Sainsbury tokens again. Lorna has said she will collect any taken into her Barber shop for us as before.



Although now a month into the New Year, it has no doubt been a time of reflection for many people. For some there will have been great joys to give thanks for – perhaps happy events which brought good and significant change to their lives. For others perhaps the year just brought losses and breakdowns they would rather not have endured, and whilst in the world such drastic changes tragically affect the lives of so many.

When, a long time ago now, I was a teenager growing up in South London, I was especially close to our parish priest and now appreciate how important his influence was. I still recall (and have no doubt repeated) his remembrance of a young lady who had left her family and her church (I think in Clapham where he was serving). As time went on she had lost all dignity as he said 'Her life went completely off the rails'. The change in her was dramatic, but some time later she realised how her way of life was wrong and destructive and she returned home to start again. Once more in her church she raced to the priest after the service and blurted out 'But nothing has changed!' He thought she was complaining and became defensive, but she was not. Rather, it had been for her a poignant reminder of God's love for her – it was no different – it was steadfast and unchanging.

In our churches the Crib is not removed until after Candlemas Sunday (5th). All change is hard to deal with, but the Crib is about the stability of our faith in a God who stoops to the heart of our world in all it's reality and reminds us that it is there we shall find him.



#### **OPPOSITES?**

Professor Brian Cox is a well known physicist who presents science programmes on television. I thoroughly enjoy not only his presentation of science but also his great enthusiasm for the subject. In his talks he often refers to "The laws of nature" and the theories of physics which are dependent upon certainties (e.g. that the earth spins on its axis every 24 hours.)

I am equally keen on watching science programmes presented by Professor Jim Al-Khalili who is a theoretical physicist. He has presented a series of programmes about Quantum Mechanics on the basis that the basic particles which constitute matter react in a random way. I hope scientists will forgive me if my understanding is incorrect. The problem is that the certainty of one and the uncertainty of the second appear to be in opposition. Science is trying to understand what is true. Should this disparity lead to the conclusion that it is not worth pursuing, or inspire a greater understanding?

The same appears to be true with religious belief. There are so many things which appear contradictory and which we do not understand, but is that a turn off or a turn on? Truth is always worth pursuing whether in science or in religious belief. I am reminded of two things : one in the Old Testament which says "If you seek me with all your heart you will find me", and one in the New Testament where Jesus says "I am the way, the truth and the life."



## **County Councillor**



A good, peaceful and healthy New Year to you.

Severe weather forecast for the South East could leave people vulnerable and Kent County Council is calling on residents to rally round to help friends, families and neighbours.

A "level three" cold weather alert has been announced by the Met Office triggering actions in the NHS, public health and social care, to support vulnerable people with health risks.

Nationally, there are thousands of excess winter deaths per year due to a drop in temperature. The ideal indoor temperature is 18-21°C (65-75°F).

If trying to save fuel, it is advisable to heat the living room during the day, the bathroom when needed and the bedroom, just before going to bed.

Other simple measures for keeping warm in the home include:

- Regular hot drinks, and hot meals help your body warm.
- Ensure warm clothes are close by. Wear several thin layers, rather than one thick one.
- Have your flu vaccine (this is free for anyone over 65, pregnant women, those with long term conditions, and children aged two to four contact your GP to make an appointment.
- Order repeat prescriptions in good time to ensure you have a good supply of any medicines you use.
- Having a family member, friend or neighbour to help out with anything from putting the bin out to collecting prescriptions or doing shopping.
- Have your heating and cooking appliances checked regularly and ensure the chimney has been swept recently.

Preparing for very cold weather means being ready to stay indoors, ensure there is enough food and medicine at home. If you have to travel or go outdoors, tips to follow include:

- Wear layers of warm clothing and shoes with slip resistant, good grip soles
- Make sure you are not caught out by snow and ice; stay tuned to the weather forecast and plan ahead with food/medicine supplies



#### St Valentine's Day - February 14th

While the European folk traditions connected with Saint Valentine and St. Valentine's Day have become marginalized by the modern Anglo-American customs connecting the day with romantic love, there are some remaining associations connecting the saint with the advent of spring.



While the custom of sending cards, flowers, chocolates and other gifts originated in the UK, Valentine's Day still remains connected with various regional customs in England. In Norfolk, a character called 'Jack' Valentine knocks on the rear door of houses leaving sweets and presents for children. Although he was leaving treats, many children were scared of this mystical person.

In the UK, just under half of the population spend money on their Valentines and around £1.3 billion is spent yearly on cards, flowers, chocolates and other gifts, with an estimated 25 million cards being sent.

In Wales, some people celebrate Dydd Santes Dwynwen (St Dwynwen's Day) on January 25 instead of (or as well as) Valentine's Day. The day commemorates St Dwynwen, the patron saint of Welsh lovers.

In the United States, about 190 million Valentine's Day cards are sent each year, not including the hundreds of millions of cards school children exchange. Additionally, in recent decades Valentine's Day has become increasingly commercialized and a popular gift-giving event, with Valentine's Day themed advertisements encouraging spending Valentine's spending has increased every year, from \$108 a person in 2010 to \$131 in 2013.
