Since the late fourth century, on the fortieth day of Easter, the Church celebrates Christ's ascension to heaven which marks the end of his earthly ministry and occurs on Thursday 30th May this year. This is closely followed by Whitsun or Whitsunday which is the name used throughout the world among Anglicans and Methodists, for the Christian festival of Pentecost, the seventh Sunday after Easter. As the first holiday of the summer, Whitsun was one of the favourite times in the traditional calendar, and Whit Sunday, or the following week, was a time for celebration. This took the form of fêtes, fairs, pageants and parades, with Whitsun ales and Morris dancing in the south of England and Whit walks and wakes in the north.

Pentecost occurs on June 9th this year being a major event for the church since it represents the birth of the early church when the Holy Spirit visits and empowers the disciples. "When the Day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. Then there appeared to them divided tongues, as of fire, and one sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance." Acts 2:1-4

You could say there is a distinctive magic to Pentecost, a truly mind blowing experience! That first Pentecost, after tongues as of fire rested on everyone and Jesus' friends and family spoke in other tongues, people gathered around to watch at nine in the morning. What they saw didn't look like many Sunday morning church services. What they saw looked more like the aftermath of a party. All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine." They weren't drunk, of course, but it did appear so. The disciples had been given the power of communication and after the coming of the Holy Spirit the disciples burst out to tell the world. This was the beginning of the church as we know it.

Our world today is unrecognisable in comparison with that facing the disciples. Our Christian challenge is to announce healing to a world which has discovered its brokenness and to shout about love and trust in a world where there is much exploitation, fear and suspicion. Perhaps another such visitation would support and energise those who still attend church, to communicate effectively and convincingly with a society that has grown increasingly secular!

All are very welcome to join in the fun of a Pentecost Parade to Pencester (PPP), 8thJune 2019 in the afternoon. This will start from various churches in Dover with people encouraged to wear brightly coloured clothes. Schools are joining in with singing, and there will be a Worship band, crafts and do bring a picnic! Feel free to contact us if you would like more information.

CTiD to help people become savvy with their cash as households feel income squeeze

Dover Money Course, part of the Christians Together in Dover (CTiD) umbrella, is set to run free sessions to help people in Dover get on top of their household finances. Members of local churches wanted to help their community to best handle the economic climate so underwent specialised training from UK charity Christians Against Poverty.

Now Dover Money Course are offering the short CAP Money course aimed to putting the joy back into money by teaching people how to chart their household income and take control of their expenditure.

Money coach Barry Barton, who will be leading the sessions, said: "With households feeling the squeeze on their disposable income, we've all got to get a bit more savvy about our money to get through these tough times. If you know how to save and budget effectively, it can have a hugely positive impact on the whole family." He added: "We hope that we can help people, quietly and confidentially, take control rather than relying on guess work so they can plan for the future and weather the storm."

The CAP Money Course has been found to be useful for newly retired people, soon-to-be students, mums dealing with mounting bills, families saving for a wedding and everyone in between.

Christians Together in Dover is one of more than 1,000 church groups of different Christian traditions across the UK who are regularly offering the course, as they work together to positively impact the communities around them.

BIGGER AND BETTER

I read this week about a group of friends who were playing a game called 'Bigger and Better'. Everyone is given something of small value (like a small coin) and they see what they can trade it for, trying to see how much 'bigger and better' they can get by trading many times. In this case, the young man started with a dime (worth almost 8 pence) and traded through a mattress, a ping-pong table, an elk head and several other trades, until he drove home in a pickup truck!

The game reminds me of a story in the Bible about a young man who had a lot of money. He was a good guy, very religious, kept all the commandments, but Jesus told this upstanding young man that if he really wanted to know God, he needed to sell all his possessions and follow Him. The man was sad about the exchange. Like me, he liked his stuff, but he liked Jesus too. Ultimately, though, that young man decided he'd worked too hard for what he had, whatever he had to trade to get to Jesus was just too important, and what Jesus had to offer was just too intangible. So he chose to keep his stuff rather than follow Jesus.

Jesus doesn't have this conversation to shame the rich young man and it's important to note here that Jesus didn't ask everybody to give up all their stuff. This is something He asked because He wanted to teach the young man that he still needed God's help, to look at what he had and decide whether he would rather have that, or trade up and have what Jesus is offering: a life with Him. The challenge that comes into sharp relief is whether we are willing to give up all we have to follow Him, to know God. Are we willing to trade up? It's a question worth asking because the answer will shape your life one way or the other.

We've all given up something at one time or another. At first, it always feels like a huge sacrifice to give up what we've got, but Jesus is offering us a real relationship with God, and abundant, eternal life. Jesus is basically saying, "Look, none of the stuff you have is going to last, including you. You've only got about a dime's worth of life now. Come and trade up, come follow Me, and you can know God." In that sense, Jesus isn't requesting a sacrifice at all. He's asking us to play Bigger and Better, where we give up ourselves and end up with Him. Why would anybody not make that trade?

Following on from the Local Council Elections which took place on 2 May, unfortunately as there was only one nomination, there were insufficient Councillors elected to form the quorum of 4 that is required.

As a consequence, a further election has been scheduled for Thursday 20 June (a Poll will only take place if more than 11 nominations were received by the deadline of 23 May, otherwise those additional nominees will be elected unopposed, to join the one already elected nominee to form the new Parish Council of up to 12 Councillors). The first meeting of the new Parish Council is likely to be on Tuesday 25 June, 7.15pm at the Baptist Church Hall.

In the meantime, I am looking after the day to day business of the Parish Council, and looking forward to meeting with the new Councillors very shortly.

The full Parish Council meets on the last Tuesday of the month (excluding August and December) at 7.15pm at the Temple Ewell Baptist Church Hall on the corner of the High Street and London Road. Parishioners are most welcome to attend and contribute to meetings.

Kent County Councillor

Become travel savvy with unique bespoke travel safety training for Kent's young people

Young people in Kent can now prepare for their adventures abroad by signing up for unique travel safety training that is only available in a limited number of counties throughout the UK. The

Education People, a Kent County Council Local Authority Trading Company (LATCo), has teamed up with a former Metropolitan Police close protection officer to provide bespoke courses aimed at teenagers and young people planning to travel alone or with friends.

Duncan Johnston, director of Kent-based Worldlywise Ltd, will deliver the course and will cover topics including which items to pack, how to stay safe and healthy, and how to avoid becoming a victim of crime, as well as giving basic first aid training. The first course will take place in Maidstone, just before schools break up for the summer holidays and is being promoted using the hashtag #BeTravelSavvy. The one-day course is designed to give youngsters the skills and knowledge necessary to travel the world safely and is not in any way intended to put them off embarking on a global adventure.

Mr Johnston, who worked for national security in Special Branch during his 30year career in the police, said: "It's important to remember that the probability of something bad happening while you're away travelling is very low. However, there have been a number of stories in the news recently about holidaymakers, and young backpackers in particular, coming to harm while abroad. The world is probably no more dangerous today than it was when I was a teenager, but young people, and their parents, are more aware of the dangers now and are actively seeking advice on how they can stay safe while travelling." The 'Education People' have been fantastic in supporting us and working with us to get this course into schools so young people can benefit from it, and we're very excited for our first course in June.

"I would never want to put anyone off travelling, in fact I would encourage young people to travel as they are likely to have some fantastic experiences and a course like ours can equip them with information, advice and skills needed to keep them safe and healthy and allow them to get the most out of their trip, whether that's a few weeks in Europe or a year travelling all over the world."

Although some travel agents offer safety advice to customers travelling abroad, The Education People and Mr Johnston believe this course is unique as it is one of only a handful in the UK aimed specifically at school leavers and young travellers. The bespoke course will also be tailored to offer advice specific to the destinations attendees plan to visit, which they will be asked to specify in advance. Parents/guardians are welcome to join their offspring in the afternoon for the first aid training and a short question and answer session but the majority of the session, which costs £100 for the full day, will be for young people only. Mr Johnston added: "We want the young people to feel confident speaking to us and raising issues they may not feel comfortable speaking about in front of their parents or teachers. However, we appreciate parents will also have concerns and questions regarding their son or daughter travelling abroad without them; and everyone can benefit from some first aid training."

Mr Johnston has travelled all over the world throughout his career, including to Syria, Libya and Afghanistan. He has worked with Prime Ministers, Presidents and members of the Royal Family as well as accompanying journalists to warzones. He drew on his experience of developing risk mitigation courses, in conjunction with working with the military, Foreign Office and private sector security companies, for unarmed police officers and civilian police staff working overseas, adapting it for a younger audience travelling for pleasure. James Roberts, CEO of The Education People, said: "We are delighted to be working with Duncan Johnston and Worldlywise Ltd to offer this course, which will allow Kent's young people to stay safe and healthy while travelling abroad. We would encourage families to register for this course sooner rather than later, particularly if their sons or daughters are planning on going away this summer, as we anticipate it proving popular."

The first travel safety course will take place at Invicta Grammar School in Maidstone from 10am to 4pm on Tuesday, June 25 and is open to young people from all schools. To request a booking form please email:
