As we move into October, we look forward to our Harvest Festival which is traditionally a celebration of the food grown on the land. Thanksgiving ceremonies and celebrations for a successful harvest are both worldwide and very ancient. In Britain, we have given thanks for successful harvests since pagan times. We celebrate this day by singing, praying and decorating our churches and this year we will share the service with our friends from Lydden. It will be a family service with our Sunday Club taking part, so do feel very welcome to join us at 10.30am on October 6th for a special service of thanks for all the food of the harvest we enjoy. It marks such an important time of year.

It's interesting to note that we have moved away from the traditional donations of fresh food and flowers, as we now take donations for local causes. The school does a wonderful job of collecting their harvest donations and displaying them in church, and this year as in previous years all items will go to Dover Foodbank. The number of families that the Foodbank is providing food too has been increasing, and they continue to ask for support to maintain their stock levels. There is a Foodbank collection box inside the church porch, so if you would like to place any items in it please do – the church is usually open every day.

This year our Gift Day will be on Saturday 12th October, and you will see one of our churchwardens sitting on the bench outside Lorna's from 10am until noon – she will be hoping for good weather! We know how much you care for our beautiful church, and this is reinforced by your kind and generous donations. We hope that we will see you at the bench as in previous years.

FLOWER FESTIVAL - Flowers Through the Ages

For three days over the last weekend of August St. Peter and Paul Church was festooned with a wonderful array of flowers and displays that portrayed various periods throughout history. At the entrance the Brownies had made a colourful presentation of paper flowers topped with an Owl. The Porch was full of grasses, a deck chair, pebbles and shells representing The Sea with the bow of a fishing boat scattered with various brightly coloured fish representing St. Peter, the fisherman.

Once into the Church there was a 'memory board' that had the names of those who were being remembered and prayers offered. Turning to the right the displays focused onto the various historical periods beginning with the Egyptian era, followed by Roman and Greek with a Dutch and Flemish display on the Font. The Tudor period filled the corner and up on the Sills and shelf the Georgian and Victorian period was beautifully portrayed in flowers. Art Noveau draped the Pulpit with an Edwardian theme dominating the Sanctuary. A beautiful display of the Church silver was spread across the Altar with a professional flower display of cream flowers and green on either side.

The display representing Art Deco attracted interest and discussion whilst in the Lady Chapel the Knights Templar were represented as was the mid-20th century florist Constance Spry. Also, and of great interest, the Church Archives were available for viewing. The Festival culminated in a 'modern' display of Hydrangea encased in a thick blue twine. Over the three days of the Festival free refreshments

were on offer up at the Millennium Hall with cakes kindly donated by volunteers. Very well done to everyone!





Welcome to my latest newsletter report for the Parish Council. It is funny that autumn seems to begin earlier but go on longer each year! We had dew on the ground and condensation on the cars from the middle of August. Let us hope we continue to have warm

days well into October. Our next Parish Council meeting will be taking place on the 24th September and there will be plenty to discuss, all parishoners welcome.

We do not get a lot of major planning applications in the village, but the development of End's Nursery into 14 executive style homes has been given the green light and building will be starting soon. Some may have seen the widening of the entrance which was one of the first steps to be taken. We hope that there will be minimal disruption in Lower Road while this work takes place.

Our new PCSO, Megan Keehner, has made a few appearances in the village and is currently in the process of re-arranging her first surgery for local residents. Tracking down Kent Highways staff requires great diligence and our Clerk, Andy has been using a variety of tactics and has finally spoken to the key person regarding traffic calming. We hope that is the near future a site meeting should lead to a plan at the junction of London Road, High Street and Templeside which is increasingly hazardous for pedestrians.

The village events committee are now focusing on the annual Christmas Lights turn on the 1st December and a 75th Anniversary VE Day Celebration next May which will be a collaboration between Parish Council, Newsletter and other interested parties. Look out for updates. On a personal note, I have been working hard on the forthcoming Temple Ewell 10K Run which is to take place on the 13th October, starting at the Kearsney Abbey end of Lower Road at 10.00am. 

An Autumn Filler - Lentil & Bacon Soup



PREP: 5 MINS COOK: 30 mins EASY SERVES 3

Blend your storecupboard pulses with cumin, turmeric and garlic to create this robust soup with crispy pancetta topping

Ingredients

1 tbsp olive oil 1 onion, diced

2 x 70g packs pancetta cubes

1 carrot (about 120g), finely diced

1 tsp ground cumin

½ tsp turmeric

2 garlic cloves, finely chopped

1 chilli, sliced

2 low-salt stock cubes

250g red lentils, rinsed

Method

Heat the olive oil in a large saucepan. Add the onion, 1 pack of pancetta and the carrot. Cook on a low to medium heat for 10 minutes until the onions are soft.

Add the cumin, turmeric, garlic and chilli and cook for a further 1-2 minutes until the aromas are released.

Pour in 1.25 litres of boiling water, crumble in the stock cubes and add the lentils. Bring to a simmer and cook for 20 mins, stirring occasionally to ensure the lentils aren't sticking.

Meanwhile, fry the remaining lardons in a small frying pan for about 10 minutes until crispy. You don't need to add any oil as plenty will run from the pancetta.

Serve the soup with a sprinkle of crispy lardons on top.
