Not quite the white Christmas we all dream of but, according to the Met Office, there have only been four occasions in the UK in the last 51 years where more than 40 per cent of stations in the UK reported snow on the ground at 9am.



Welcome to my latest Newsletter report for the Parish Council. I would firstly like to thank Kylie Marsh for agreeing to become a new Parish Councillor. Her contributions to our meetings and work in the village will be appreciated.

I was driving to Leeds on the 7th November and was held up by the biblical rain and flooding. The A1 and M1 were closed plus other roads and all traffic converged on one roundabout. Nearly five hours later and we were on our way again. We are lucky that despite the wet autumn, Temple Ewell has not been hit by quite such extreme conditions likely to be caused by global warming!

Our next Parish Council meeting will be taking place on the 26th November and all parishoners are welcome. Incidentally, this is the date when the Vice Chairman and myself will be choosing the village Christmas Tree. By the time you read this, we will be in full swing to get Players' Corner ready for the annual Christmas lights turn-on which will be from 5.30pm on the 1st December. We hope to see a good gathering of villagers and will once again have music from the Betteshanger Colliery Band plus Santa Claus distributing gifts. There will also be festive food and drink.

Looking a little further ahead, we are planning a VE day celebration to mark the 75th Anniversary of the end of World War 2 on 8th May 2020. This will be a bank holiday and it is hoped we will have a programme of activities including a 1940's dance, street party and other activities. This will be a joint event between Parish Council, Newsletter etc.

We have completed the HIP (Highways Improvement Plan) with Kent Highways which is the start point to getting some traffic calming at the junction of London Road, High Street and Templeside. We are just waiting for a site meeting to progress towards improved pedestrian safety in this part of the village.

They are currently looking to fell some trees to help make a better area for car parking, but are not looking at any major alterations to the buildings.



Is Alcohol unknowingly damaging your health?

Figures show the majority of people (79%) drink sensibly and in safe limits but in Kent, approximately 254,000 people are drinking above the recommended safe limits.*

There are an estimated 14,000 dependent drinkers in Kent in need of some treatment and support. Kent specialist treatment

services can help those in serious risk of harm, and last year around 2,100 people were receiving help from specialist support services.

The Department of Health recommends drinking levels do not regularly exceed more than 14 units a week. One pint of strong beer or cider equals three units, as does a large glass (250ml) of wine. A small glass of wine (175ml) amounts to two units while a bottle of beer can mean 1.5 units but these can all vary depending on the alcoholic strength of the drink.

Many people simply are not aware of how much they are drinking. The KCC 'Know Your Score' interactive online test - www.kent.gov.uk/knowyourscore - can help give some initial guidance by asking users a series of simple questions to help them gauge how much alcohol they are consuming and the effects it could have on their health, in both the short and long-term. Depending on their score, appropriate key messages and vital advice about where to find help are then delivered by different experts and health professionals.

Excessive alcohol consumption can frequently lead to high blood pressure and can trigger an irregular heartbeat, both of which increase the risk of having a stroke. It is also a risk factor for some cancers, particularly head and neck cancers and breast cancer. Heavy drinking increases the risk of having a stroke by more than three times. By drinking sensibly and to the recommended limits you will reduce your risk of having a stroke.

KCC Director for Public Health, Andrew Scott-Clark said: "People often underestimate how much they are drinking and it's very easy to go over the safe limits. The 'Know Your Score' tool can help you know if you need treatment. Many people don't realise they may have become dependent on alcohol – at which point they might need treatment. "There are a range of services available in Kent with health, community and voluntary sectors all helping to get people the treatment they need. If you or a loved one is facing the problems of alcohol addiction, please don't suffer alone. We also have lifestyle services in the community that can support people if they need further help to cut back. Services like One You Kent. 'Know Your Score' will help you to get help if you need it."

A range of formal and informal support is available, such as AA and Smart Recovery (peer support) in Kent and Al-anon for friends, family and carers of alcoholics. KCC also commissions specialist treatment providers to provide structured treatment for alcohol addiction. Forward Trust runs the East Kent Community Drug and Alcohol Service while Change Grow Live (CGL) provides the West Kent Drug and Alcohol Wellbeing Service.

Community-Led Housing

Community-led housing is when communities come together to develop the homes that are needed in their local community. This housing can be for rent, low cost ownership, or for sale, but it is designed to be always affordable for the community that needs it. Community-led housing can take many forms, and as such it is flexible to suit the requirements of a range of different circumstances.

Community groups with ideas for delivering community-led housing in their area, but who need some financial assistance to help get their projects started, are invited to apply for the DDC Community Housing Grants scheme.

Dover District Council Funding Continues into 2020

There are two levels of funding and groups can apply for one in each year:

- Up to £3k to assist in the early stages of a project for groups to run
 consultation events, attend training, engage with consultants, identify a
 site, evidence housing need and demand, etc.
- Up to £10k for projects at a more advanced stage for assistance with initiation costs such as surveys, feasibility studies, planning advice, etc.

The purpose of the funding is primarily to build skills and knowledge amongst communities, to help them to investigate the feasibility of providing community-led affordable housing developments, but also to contribute towards specialist support and consultancy services where appropriate.
