### **Temple Ewell Parish Council**

Apologies for my absence last month, I was taken ill and spent a short period in the William Harvey Hospital. I received excellent treatment and have nothing but praise for the way the NHS dealt with my condition.

On health related issues, I guess the thing which is on everyone's mind is Coronavirus. It is across all news headlines and has certainly spooked financial markets and also many folk into panic buying of essentials. We suggest that parishioners follow the government's advice and guidelines. Please look out for any neighbours (especially the elderly) that may be struggling during this crisis. We will also have to evaluate our proposed celebrations for VE Day on the 8<sup>th</sup> May and see whether the proposed events (street party and 40's dance) will still take place.

Regarding the weather, we have been quite lucky with very few frosty mornings this winter, although I think we have had enough of rain and high winds to contend with. We can hopefully now look forward to brighter and warmer weather for spring and summer with the clocks having just gone forward.

At our last Parish Council Meeting we updated on the Highways Improvement Plan (HIP). We have been fortunate to obtain funding from KCC to pay for the traffic survey which will monitor speeding traffic in London Road (by the George and Dragon), Lower Road and in close proximity to the school entrance. It is hoped that this will take place before the end of March. There is also a plan for an additional traffic survey in London Road by the Railway Bell which has been initiated by River Parish Council. We do have serious concerns regarding the safety of our parishioners on our busy roads and a recent accident by the George and Dragon, where a wall was demolished and barrier damaged, strengthens our argument to have measures put in place to improve road safety.

I recently attended a meeting at the DDC offices to look at the Local Plan for housing development for the next 5 years. There are fortunately no areas in Temple Ewell earmarked for development. However, the council has recently had a planning application for the Railway Bell site where the developer wants to convert the former pub into 6 flats, put 5 town houses into the garden and build a bungalow in the car park. Any objections will need to placed with DDC by the 3<sup>rd</sup> April. My feeling is that it would be sad to lose a village amenity which with the right ownership, possibly operating as a restaurant with rooms, could bring tourism to the village and also be an additional social hub. The plans seem to involve a lot of over-development of the site on what is a very busy junction with insufficient parking.

Now that the Parish Council have Social Media accounts for both Facebook and Twitter, it would be good to hear from parishioners with any comments that they may like to make. Also, any photographs of Temple Ewell may be submitted to be featured on our Website or Facebook.

What an action-packed month April is, with a see-saw of emotions! We remember Jesus entering Jerusalem with so many people welcoming and cheering him on his journey. If you visit Temple Ewell Church on Good Friday, you will find the altar is stripped to remind us of the table at which the disciples shared the last supper with Jesus. All will be restored for Easter Sunday and the joy of Jesus' resurrection.

The story of Lazarus, the poor man at the rich man's door, Luke:16 19-31 may be a relevant reflection at this time. A very wealthy man, who was splendidly clothed daily feasted on the best of everything but shared no scraps with anyone. He was a very well-informed man but his heart was closed. Knowledge did not touch this man, he was not interested or moved by the difficulties or hardships facing others. Lazarus, a diseased beggar, lay at the rich man's door, longing for scraps but receiving nothing.

This can happen in our lives where we may be comfortable, perhaps not incredibly rich but certainly not in need. We see so much in the news with children suffering from hunger, losing their parents, fleeing wars and having no possible medical care, the refugee and migrant problem feels too huge for any of us to solve. So, for many, our lives continue with us being untouched.

Perhaps we should remember this indifference to the situation others may find themselves in as Coronavirus moves with speed across our country. Many people live alone and must be fearful of what the news brings. Many face the likelihood of losing their jobs with few resources on which to fall back. Many will find it difficult to shop. We all face the fear of losing those we love. Our village does have good networks so we need to work hard to maintain these and remember others. Let's keep an eye on our neighbours, particularly the elderly, and do what we can to help them.

### **County Councillor**

Kent County Council's environment champion is calling on advertisers to insist waste carriers include their licence number in advertisements. KCC, together with district and borough colleagues, is urging companies that sell

advertising to insist it is part of the text in a bid to crack down on fly tipping.

KCC Cabinet Member for Environment Susan Carey said: "There isn't currently a legal requirement to display carrier registration numbers which means anyone can advertise their business without having to prove they're registered. Some operators use their registration number as part of their advertising to prove legitimacy, but many don't – that's not to say they are not legitimate, but if they were made to, we could squeeze illegitimate operators out of the trade. I'm urging those that carry advertising to ensure all of their customers in the waste disposal trade do this."

One of the biggest areas of concern is on social media, particularly Facebook pages and groups where anyone can advertise for free. Mrs Carey added: "I would urge owners of Facebook pages and groups to not allow users to post advertisements for waste removal unless they can prove they're a legitimate business. It might seem innocuous that a 'man and a van' is offering to remove people's unwanted items for a few pounds, but it can leave a huge bill for your district or borough council or for a private landowner such as a farmer, if they turn out to be a rogue trader. The cost to remove the waste hits farmers hard in the pocket, not to mention the environmental impact on rivers, soil, grazing animals and wildlife. It's unfair that rogue traders can leave legitimate businesses suffering."

Rogue traders often target householders with cheap rates to take their rubbish away and then dump the waste, leaving the bill for removal and disposal with others. If the waste is traced back to its original source, it can leave people with a fine of up to £400.

KCC has funded a £250,000 anti-fly tipping campaign, working with Kent Police and the district councils to target criminals who damage the countryside and to raise awareness of the risks of using

unlicensed waste carriers. Fly tipped waste delivered by the district and borough councils to KCC for disposal between June and November reduced by 1%, equivalent to nearly 16 tonnes, compared with the same months in the previous year.

Residents are advised to check the waste management operator they use is a registered waste carrier:

- Registration documents should available on request and should be inspected before services are rendered or money paid. You can check environmental permits and waste carriers' licences online by searching the EA public registers or call 03708 506506.
- Get a written receipt/transfer note complete with contact details, a description of waste removed and details of where the waste is being taken to.
- Note down the vehicle type, colour and registration number of the vehicle that's taking your waste away.
