



It seems we are getting used to a more relaxed level of restrictions relating to Coronavirus. However it is still important for government guidelines to be followed to help keep infection rates and of course deaths as low as

possible. Recent changes have seen the need to wear face masks in shops but also the opening of pubs and restaurants plus leisure centres and swimming pools.

For a lot of us, this will be the first summer in many years without a foreign holiday, and it will be time to enjoy the British climate. We are lucky that in East Kent we have some great places to go for days out and most seaside towns will be operating with some degree of normality. Hopefully the beaches will not be too busy but as an alternative there are plenty of places to go for country walks and picnics. We have been keen to see progress in the work towards completion of the Kearsney Parks project which has had umpteen delays. It does seem that DDC are now taking closer control and hopefully we will soon be seeing the opening of the parking extension and the café and toilets for at least part of the summer.

Regarding Kearsney Parks, there is currently a proposal from DDC to put double yellow lines along the 30mph stretch of the Alkham Valley Road. We have protested about the extent of this and the failure to deal with any potential knock on effects in Temple Ewell, particularly Lower Road. We hope that our worries will be listened to.

The village school has just broken up for summer and it is pleasing to report that it will be fully reopening in September for all pupils. Our children's education is most important and it has been sad that there has been so much disruption to this over the past few months. Whilst on the subject of the school, it was recently the 1st anniversary of the death of one of their pupils, Josh Harbour, from leukaemia. This was marked by a gathering at the roundabout at the top of Target Firs and the placing of candles, flowers and balloons. The Parish Council send their wishes to the family on this sad occasion.

We had a very productive Parish Council meeting last month online by Zoom and also streamed this on Facebook. Although the agenda was fairly compact there were a number of important decisions that were made. Going forward we hope to be back to having face to face meetings once again although it is possible that they may be held either outside or back in our regular home of the Baptist Hall using applicable social distancing.

Our new website is taking shape and our clerk has made excellent progress in its production. We are expecting it to go live in the near future and can be shared with parishioners.

Regarding the proposed development of the Railway Bell we have heard that it has been called into committee by DDC which does give the opportunity for a more detailed scrutiny. A decision should be made by the next newsletter.

At our last meeting, we discussed the noise, damage and danger caused by the illegal motorbikes and quadbikes up on the Minnis and other areas around the village. The police seem to be taking this seriously and we have been informed that they propose to crack down on types of anti-social behaviour such as this. If you hear or come across nuisance motorcycles/ quad bikes, please report this to the police using 101.

I hope you enjoy the summer in our beautiful village and will update you again next month.

In line with the Church of England Coronavirus guidance we had to restrict the number of people attending the service, and our plans for a big celebration after it were shelved, but it is wonderful to finally have lan and Frauke in place and we hope that they will be very happy here.


Both churches have been open for private prayer since the middle of June. In Temple Ewell the church opens from 10am until 2pm on Sunday, Tuesday and Thursday, and in Lydden it is open every day. However, we took the decision not to resume Sunday services until Ian was on board, so the first service we will have is scheduled for 9th August. We will have to plan carefully exactly how we do this – no singing allowed! – but we will get there, and it will be wonderful to be able to gather together again to worship.

Although restrictions are being eased on a weekly basis, we are still far from what we call "normal" in so many ways, and interestingly, a recent poll has suggested that only 12% of the population wants to go back to the way things were. Should we just wait and see what happens, or should we be actively working towards developing models that will suit us in the future? What have we learned from lockdown that might impact how we move forwards as church and village communities? How will we be positioned to help those who may need it in the future, such as those without jobs, the elderly and the vulnerable? There are a lot of questions to grapple with as we begin to meet together in our various organisations; we hope that from the hardships of the Coronavirus lockdown we can find new opportunities to benefit us all.

What is Community-Led Housing?

Community-led housing is when communities come together to develop the homes that are needed in their local community. This housing can be for rent, low cost ownership, or for sale, but it is designed to be always affordable for the community that needs it. Community-led housing can take many forms, and as such it is flexible to suit the requirements of a range of different circumstances.

Community groups with ideas for delivering community-led housing in their area, but who need some financial assistance to help get their projects started, are invited to apply for the DDC Community Housing Grants scheme.

Facilities in Kearsney Abbey

Can we remind everyone that the café, toilets and play area in Kearsney Abbey are all closed at the moment. Please note there are no temporary facilities on site during the development works.

Please do not leave litter or any other waste in the park and please be respectful of the parks' neighbours.

Please think about cycling or walking to the parks. If you drive, please think about the nearby residents. Please park considerately, and do not block emergency access routes. Thank you.

Works Update

Work in the parks is continuing, in line with government guidelines. In Kearsney Abbey, the terracing is being laid in front of the café. Our contractors have been surveying the area at the end of the boating lake, ahead of the new bridge being installed. The bridge will create a circular walkway around the lake, which was part of Kearsney Abbey's 19th century design.

We've uncovered more of the river on the south side of the lake, to improve the river habitat for brown trout. Plants will be planted along the banksides, and some areas of the river remain covered, to provide shelter for the fish.

In Russell Gardens, the sub-bases and edgings for the new pathways have been laid. A yew hedge is being planted as part of the restoration of Thomas Mawson's original garden design. Yew hedges were a classic feature of Edwardian gardens. A grand border of dozens of species including cosmos, crocosmia, hibiscus, lobelia, penstemon, and salvia will be planted inside the hedged area.

New look for Kearsney Abbey as culverts are opened up to improve wildlife habitat

Kearsney Abbey is taking on a whole new look as the culverts on the south side of the lake are opened up as part of the Kearsney Parks project. As well as improving facilities and the visitor experience, one of the key aims of the project is to maintain and enhance the biodiversity of Kearsney Abbey and Russell Gardens.

The culverts in Kearsney Abbey are a legacy of the mills which historically operated in the area. Opening up the culverts will improve the wildlife habitat, including the opportunity for fish migration and spawning.

The culvert works have been part-funded by the Environment Agency who support the opening up of culverts to better manage waterways. Culverts can easily become blocked by debris and litter which restricts river flow, impedes fish migration, and increases flood risk.

Once the work to open up the culverts is complete the river banks will be stabilised and re-seeded, along with marginal planting to further improve biodiversity.

KCC Director of Public Health response to national media reports re Ashford and Folkestone

As part of our outbreak plans, we work closely with Public Health England to monitor the figures across Kent - the

seven day rolling average for Ashford and Folkestone continues to decline from the peak seen in April/May, so this PHE report does not mean there is a current need for any local lockdowns.

While the figure for cumulative confirmed cases will always appear high for these areas, there is no comparison to be made between the rates of new cases currently occurring in Ashford and Folkestone, and areas such as Leicester.

We have seen a number of infections in care settings and these are being effectively managed but we have not seen any evidence of any widespread community transmission of COVID-19 and there are currently no plans to introduce any lockdowns specifically these areas. Should, however, the need arise, we will not hesitate to take further steps should it be necessary.

Ashford and Folkestone have seen higher rates than other areas and is a combination of higher testing rates earlier in the pandemic, a large NHS Trust and many care homes in the area plus the London commuter effect.

We have known Ashford has experienced high numbers for a while and as a result we have deployed mobile testing sites to this area to increase the amount of people who are tested to allow us to better understand how and why this is happening. As a result we are finding more positive results because we know that some people can be infected with Covid-19, but not exhibit symptoms (asymptomatic cases).

The public should be reassured that the levels of testing across the whole of

Kent have also been ramped up and we would expect to see a rise in the number of cumulative confirmed cases.

We have increased our testing capacity so that we are able to identify and confirm cases in our community and support the NHS Test and Trace programme. We appeal to residents to follow the guidance should they be contacted by NHS test and trace. This will all help us control the spread of the virus. The NHS in the region have also been working hard making sure that there is sufficient testing resources for their patients and staff to get the testing that they need to support their safety and treatment.

The Government has also set up a home-testing service where kits can be delivered to someone's door so they can test themselves and their family without leaving the house.

The message to residents remains clear – to follow national guidance on social distancing, use thorough and regular handwashing, and follow advice if contacted by the NHS Test and Trace system. For more information, go to <u>www.kent.gov.uk/kentprotect</u>
