Just when we thought we were going to have a restriction free summer, the Indian (Delta) variant of Covid-19 comes along and causes this to be delayed by 4 weeks. The main difference with the current increase in infections is that hospital admissions and death rates are remaining fairly low. Also, the additional time gives the chance for many more people to be vaccinated which will increase the number protected from catching the virus. Please make sure that you have the vaccination as soon as this is offered to you as although infections in East Kent are staying fairly low, every little bit helps !

The Open Golf is coming to Sandwich from the 15th to 18th of July and by the time you read this we should know how many spectators will be allowed. For a major global event and the largest taking place in East Kent, it will be a pity if it is held behind closed doors. Let us hope that a good proportion of spectators are allowed and that those of you wishing to attend are able to.

The Parish Council meeting on the 29th June we hope will have taken place outdoors in the Baptist Church Garden. If the weather is poor, we do reserve the right to hold it indoors although have to make sure that all councillors are socially distanced and any members of the public wear face masks throughout.

We expect the Lower Road part of the Highways Improvement Plan (HIP) to be installed any day now with 20mph throughout, "NO HGV" signs plus extra double yellow lines. We can report that path to the allotments by the side of St Michaels children's home has now been resurfaced. It now has a much improved tarmac surface and is a lot easier for pedestrians and cars to negotiate. It also means that the St Michaels bin that was partly blocking the footpath for some months has now able to be placed back on it's plinth, out of peoples way !

We will hopefully have appointed a new handyman following interviews during the middle of June. His identity will be revealed in the coming weeks and he will be seen in the village performing the range of tasks which keep our village neat and tidy. The Village Hall have held a committee meeting where tasks were given out and plans cemented for the hall to re-open. Various work has been done to the hall although the floor is still proving troublesome. Many of the regular bookers have started to take space and hopefully the hall will be back to normal soon. Parish Council are currently helping to steer this with Andy (The Clerk) and Kirsty (Parish Council Vice Chair) sitting on the committee. The booking of the village hall can now be made by contacting John Holness either by phone, webpage or the new email address.

Progress has been made in the organisation of the music event on the 28th August in memory of former villager Roger Marsden. Bands, toilets and food and refreshments are booked. The event will be held on the King George V playing field from 1.00pm to 9.00pm. The event has been part financed by a grant from Parish Council and although FREE to attend is raising money for cancer charities. Please put this village event in your diaries.

While we are talking events, we are starting to think about a village Christmas event, which will hopefully be a bit more of a gathering than the virtual one we organised last year ! This year it will be held on Sunday 5th December.

The weather finally changed for the good in the early part of June and it looks like we could have a hot dry summer. I have been up on the hills surrounding the village and enjoying the wide range of distant views that can be experienced. I often wonder what it must have been like hundreds of years ago when major roads did not exist and many narrow paths would have been the major thoroughfares. Certainly most ancient (mainly religious) structures such as the Knights Templar preceptory at Temple Farm would have had routes to Temple Ewell Chuch, St. Radigunds Abbey and St John's Commandery.

Thank you for reading and I look forward to catching up with you again at the end of July.

Village Hall

The committee has been busy preparing the Village Hall for life after lockdown. Following an appeal for additional Trustees to assist with the running of the hall Kirsty Price, Mike Brodie and Andy Howard-Grigg recently volunteered to get involved and join Geoff Roberts (Chairman) and John Holness (Bookings Secretary). Mike has taken the post of Secretary, Andy has taken over as Treasurer whilst Kirsty, as well as bringing her experience from the PC where she also serves, has reduced the average age of the committee by about thirty years!

The Trustees have already met and are hitting the ground running with both physical and organisational improvements to the hall. These include amongst other things curtains for the lower hall, treatment of the damp problem in wood-work and plaster in the lower hall ladies' toilets, and complete redecoration of the upper hall. We hope to have the latter completed by the time the hall is fully reopened. On the organisational side, the hall will be raising its public profile with a dedicated Facebook page and potentially its own website, and we also plan to submit regular reports to this newsletter.

As village organisations and others further afield return they will be encouraged, particularly those who hire regularly, to have one representative on the committee who will become a Trustee. Full Trustee indemnity insurance is now in place ensuring there is no financial liability as a Trustee. As a Trustee they will be able to vote on all decisions regarding the running of the hall. Organisations may alternatively have a representative who does not wish to be a Trustee, but they will not have voting rights.

As lockdown eases we anticipate a marked increase in hiring, indeed Branching Out has already restarted with the Players, Men's Club and two art groups keen to recommence once restrictions allow.

Due to those same restrictions, the AGM is long overdue and will be held on Monday 28th June at 7pm in the upper hall. Depending on the speed of the printers and your local newsletter deliverer you may be reading this before the 28th, but every effort is being made to publicise this date around the village as everyone is of course welcome to attend.

It only remains for me to close by thanking Robert Hamer for his professional expertise, time spent and support given during his tenure as Treasurer.

On a warm sunny morning this week Mr Robbins class from Temple Ewell School joined Revd Ian and myself for a very simple act of Worship in the churchyard of St Peter & St Paul's. Children read the prayers, we sang All things Bright & Beautiful and listened to the Story of the Good Samaritan. The children finished with exploring the churchyard on an "Eco Quest". They really looked carefully and listened to everything round them finding different leaves and plants, discovering minute yellow and white lichen growing on the tombstones, the huge Yew trees and were fascinated with a Buzzard gently floating high in the sky. The church yard is a very peaceful and beautiful place to sit and escape from the pressures and tensions that often dominate our daily lives giving the space to wonder at the intricacies of creation.

The Good Samaritan story presents us with challenges to help and care for those different to ourselves, to face up and work beyond our prejudices. It encourages a reaching out to the stranger and outsider, to treat all people with fairness and compassion showing tolerance and generosity.

lan showed the class a blank sheet of paper relating a story of interconnectedness behind it. It started life as a seed planted in the soil by a human and slowly growing into a tree. It would be harvested by a farmer, taken to a factory to be processed, then to a shop where we can buy it as paper.

Interconnectedness is a new way of thinking for me but once you focus you

realise it underpins the way in which people, nature, and objects interact with each other forming a whole that operates as a system. Everything in the world is interconnected, we are not only connected to other people but to the air through our breathing, to the universe through light and our place in the galaxy. There is an interconnectedness between societies so that events in one part of the world can impact on other people and societies far away.

There seems to have been a united and pragmatic approach to tackling the worldwide pandemic crisis from the Leaders of the G7 summit. Their other focus on the fragility of our planet will hopefully result in Leaders pledging determined action to foster positive ecological systems, unifying interconnectedness across the world, enabling nature to recover and flourish across our planet.

Obviously and sadly the covid pandemic has taken up most of our time, but I am very happy to report as a the digital lead for DDC, that the roll out of our digital services being in place, just in time via the modernisation program, have been invaluable to the East Kent region. It has also greatly benefited all residents, including those not online, because many friends and neighbours have engaged to report their key issues. I am pleased to say all issues reported to us directly, have all been dealt with.

Myself and David have also worked hard to encourage all parishes to be online, which was completed very effectively, with the last parish completing a few months ago. DDC will be offering the remote options on all meetings going forward, we need to do this to keep a plan B in place. I would encourage all parishes to make sure this option is available and tested live for each meeting. It does give access to residents who cannot attend or are housebound, so we would support full transparent online access.

We have also ignored the previous culture flying around to not ever deal with offenders in the area and have ramped up local ward online reporting and evidence/images being submitted to us both, so we can take action on your behalf, this has proved to be very effective, as planned, recent cases include Scotland common joint operations with DDC, Police CSU and the MOD, as well as effective bike and noise reporting. As a direct result of recent cases DDC is focussing on its enforcement and a speedier system internally elsewhere. Repeat offenders will be dealt with and several have been charged or fined recently, much to the benefit of residents locally. We will continue to focus on repeat offences in your AONB rural ward.

We at DDC, alongside our MP Natalie Elphicke, do very much welcome the 150 local new jobs and the presence of a managed Inland Border Force Facility (IBF) in Whitfield (see below statement link). This will help manage the area like never before, and we have already seen a great road update to benefit the tired and worn out Whitfield roundabout, long, long overdue.

DDC also look forward to supporting the progress of the Rapid Bus Transport (RBT) system and we have both supported the applications many months ago to progress for the wider benefit of Dover, this will prove to be a success and the usual negative comments and rumours will slip away onto something else no doubt. Lastly, I will support to see more positive progress with KCC going forward with a much more 'can do' attitude in place, so we can achieve important and basic highways maintenance and road repairs far easier locally.

The important focus here, post the pandemic, is to take forward current Parish Council digital capacity and online meeting options via Zoom or Microsoft teams for all working or housebound residents enabling full access and engagement at home or with younger families. It has been extraordinary to see the much bigger input and views since being online, proving this option is now very popular across the wider ward of Dover Downs and River, which includes the villages of River, Temple Ewell, Denton, Wootton and Lydden.
