FREEDOM

"Man was born free and everywhere he is in chains" are words which were written by the Swiss philosopher Jean-Jacques Rousseau. His words had effect on the French Revolution. Unfortunately this expression appears as relevant today as the day it was written. We see the pitiful plight of refugees trying to cross the channel, and the tragedy of girls and women in Afghanistan, all seeking release from the chains that bind.

Long before the writings of Rousseau, the issue of human freedom is of crucial importance in the Bible. God gave the first man, Adam, complete freedom to choose between right and wrong. In the New Testament Jesus echoes this freedom in his parable about the lost son. In this story the younger son asks for his half of the inheritance, but he wanted it before his father died. I do not know of anyone who would grant such a request, but in his story Jesus says that the father did as he was asked, and gave the money to his son. Without being given this money the son would have had no option but to stay put. The father wanted his son to have freedom even though he knew the horrendous outcome. This Freedom God the heavenly Father gives to each one of us. Our decisions cannot be separated from their consequences in order for this freedom to exist. The younger son wasted all he had and ended up penniless.

On the twentieth anniversary of the 9/11 bombings in America, it was sometimes asked why God did not intervene. The same principle seems to apply: that man has freedom to choose, but lives with the consequences.

Our own situation is that we have misused this freedom and gone away from our heavenly Father. The author of the story, Jesus Christ, provides in himself the possibility of a return, no matter how far away we may have gone.

We are pleased to say that services are now held each week but we maintain Covid restrictions. All are welcome with a service on Sunday at 10.30am. If you would like us to pray for a particular need or require assistance in the mean time, then please telephone one of the numbers below.

Temple Ewell Parish Council

As we start to enter autumn, there does seem to be more hope that we can live with the current limited restrictions that we currently have for the Covid-19 pandemic. With the higher number of people taking up the vaccination, fewer people are becoming really ill and hospital admissions and death rates are remaining lower. We also continue to have lower infection rates in East Kent than most other parts of the country. Parishioners now have a lot more personal choice as to whether they wish to still wear face masks and or socially distance. I do however encourage you not to take unnecessary risks and avoid crowded spaces if possible.

We had no Parish Council meeting in August although by the time you read this we will have just had our latest meeting on the 28th September.

The Lower Road area has now had the work completed as part of the HIP (Highways Improvement Plan) with “20mph” speed limit and “Unsuitable for HGV’s” signage in place to supplement the additional double yellow lines. These restrictions also apply to the whole of the conservation area of High Street, Templar Road, Mill Street, Brookside and Church Hill. Let us hope this makes the roads safer for pedestrians and that drivers will take heed of the new limitations.

We have been getting quotes for the resurfacing of Dragon Wood car park, so that it provides a more even surface throughout the winter with fewer potholes and puddles. We aim to have this work completed before the end of October.

As you may have seen on the news, there are problems caused to many companies by staff shortages and Covid Isolations. This is also a problem for KCC and DDC and their contractors. This has caused delays to verge cutting, emptying of dog waste bins, household waste collections and fixing non-working streetlights. We apologise for these services not being up to the required standards at the moment and are lobbying the various agencies involved to provide the services we expect.

I would like to report on a joyous event which took place on the 28th August in the village field in the form of “Rock for Rog” a live music event in memory of former villager Roger Marsden. The day was a great success and was well attended. There were several bands and those spectating braved the showery weather, often sheltering under one of the many

gazebos that graced the field. There was enthusiastic dancing and also a busy bar and food tent for those that had not brought picnics. A raffle organised by Alison Worton raised significant funds for Cancer Research. The village beacon which Roger helped to design was also lit at dusk. This event was part funded by Parish Council and we would like to thank Roger Knight, Carol Marsden and their team for all their hard work in organising it.

The annual village footpath walk took place on Sunday 12th September and was well attended by villagers who split into 2 groups. One group led by our clerk Andy Howard Grigg, proceeded to walk along the footpaths over the Minnis and Scotland Common. The other group led by Vice Chairman Kirsty Price included a number of children, and they walked over the Temple Ewell nature reserve as far as the A2. Several dogs were walked on both routes. WI kindly provided delicious refreshments following the walk which were served in the Lower Village Hall.

The next village event will be the annual Christmas light turn on ceremony which this year will be held on Sunday 5th December. We have booked Betteshanger Colliery Band to play seasonal music, there will be mince pies and mulled wine and we expect an appearance from Santa Claus. We hope you can put this in your diaries as the traditional start of the Christmas festivities in the village.

The warm weather that greeted us in early September was a pleasant improvement on the cold and wet summer. I even managed to get in a couple of sea swims but I am not as hardy as a number of villagers who I am told, brave the sea throughout the year ! However, it does seem more common for warm weather to stay with us well into October which I hope can be the case this year. I have found that as the nights start to draw in, it is still inviting to go out for an evening stroll before dusk.

Thank you for reading and I look forward to catching up with you again at the end of September.

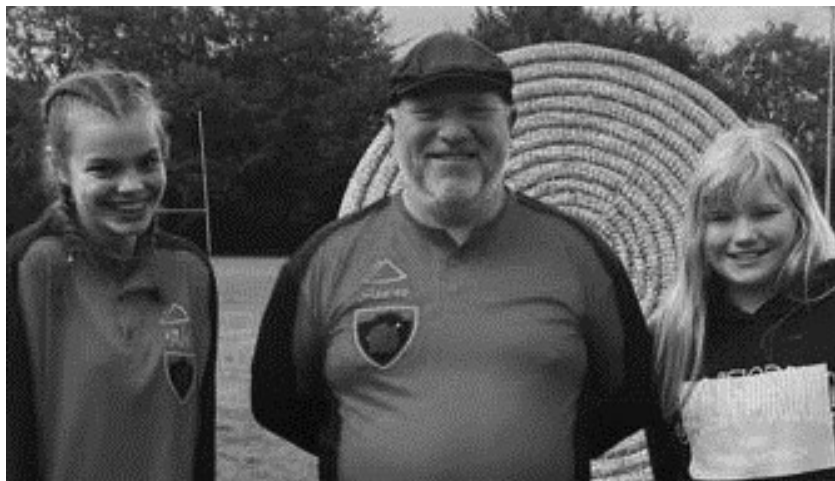
DOVER CASTLE ARCHERS

Compassion to Refugees

The Bishop of Dover has recently said that we need to be more 'compassionate' towards the refugees, saying we cannot simply "pull up the drawbridge" and dismiss the plight of refugees hoping to make their way to the UK.

So how do we show compassion to refugees?

Looking across our world today there are probably hundreds of millions of people who could claim asylum. These include: Christians, atheists, other religious minorities, ethnic minorities, political dissidents, and women. How many of these can or should be admitted to the UK? This does not include those who wish to leave lives of poverty in their own lands for the wealth of the west.

There are three possible options. We could admit all, some, or none.

All It would seem clear that to admit all who might wish to come to our shores is quite impossible. The numbers would be overwhelming.

Some What about admitting some? Admitting some could be said to encourage others to take huge risks in travelling, some perishing in the attempt.

Such a policy also encourages people traffickers. These are negative consequences of trying to be compassionate.

None What about admitting none? One consequence of returning those who try to enter will be the opposite of the all or some - it will undercut the trade of the people traffickers and discourage hazardous journeys across the sea. Those who support admitting all or some will claim their approach is compassionate, though their opponents will claim that such people are unrealistic. Whilst those who push men, women, and children back from our shores will be accused of being hard-hearted.

I'm not at all sure that any approach has an abundance of compassion. It is easy (cheap even) to accuse that those with whom we disagree of lacking compassion; it is more challenging to deal with practicalities. I wonder what practical things we could do?



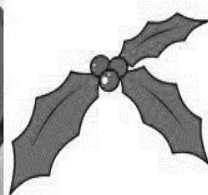

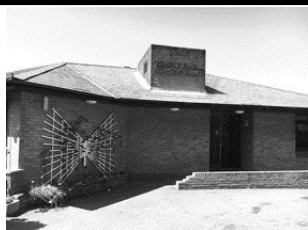
