



One of the most useful things for me has been a ladder. This is lightweight aluminium, in 4 sections which easily fit together, and they will fit into a car boot. The ladder is 12 feet long and enables me to make contact with what was, previously, completely out of reach.

The Bible says that each one of us is in a hole of our own making and it is impossible to climb out. We are stuck. We live and die in this hole unless help comes. We need someone to come along with a ladder.

This is the wonderful present we can receive at Christmas, A LADDER in the form of Jesus (God's Son). We can enter a heavenly kingdom that was previously out of reach.

Covid-19 rumbles on and the level of infections and deaths remains significant. However, we will hopefully be able to get through winter

without any further lockdowns. This will certainly help if parishioners make sure they have been vaccinated, both double jabbed and then take the booster when they are called. We are fortunate that East Kent has a relatively low infection rate, but we do still need to be vigilant and take a common sense approach to risk.

We are still engaging with Kent Highways regarding the future development of our HIP (Highway Improvement Plan). The new Zebra Crossing on London Road just past the Alkham Valley Road junction is now fully functioning and should make crossing London Road safer in this part of the village. We will next be looking at calming and slowing traffic as it passes along London Road through the village. Another issue we will be discussing is how to reduce the number of commercial vehicles that bottom out and get stuck at the turn into Wellington Road from the Lydden direction because of the gradient and camber at this point.

Also on our agenda is bringing back a Lollipop person to make it safer for children crossing London Road from Templeside, getting to and from school. The head teacher at the school is currently assessing amongst parents whether this is a service that would be used sufficiently to warrant the recruitment. It is hoped this would reduce traffic around the school at arrival/departure time. It may also encourage greater use of Dragon Wood car park which, as I mentioned last time, now has a much improved surface.

If we get a positive response, we will be working with the school to recruit someone to undertake this work. Please contact the Parish Clerk if you would be interested in this post. It is a paid role and involves 45 minutes morning and afternoon during term time.

We have been informed that planning permission has been granted for the redevelopment of the Railway Bell site. This will involve 6 apartments in the existing building and 3 pairs of semi-detached houses to be built on the car park and garden. We will aim to work with the developer to make sure there is the minimum amount of disruption. We have also been negotiating with Dover District Council to have some of the money that the developer has to provide for the local community, to be used on upgrading

open spaces around the village. We will report more on this as soon as we have any more news.

Remembrance this year was particularly poignant in the village as not only was there a church service for the school on the 11th November, but there was a Service of Remembrance which was well attended, that took place on Sunday 14th November also at St Peter and St Paul Church. The Parish Council announced last month that we had purchased our own "Tommy" statue which was installed before the 14th November at Players Corner, overlooking and keeping guard over our Stone of Remembrance. In addition to the laying of wreaths at the War Memorial in the Churchyard, there was a dedication of this other point of remembrance in the village by Reverend Ian Parrish and also the laying of wreaths. We hope that these services provided ample opportunity for local residents to pay respects to those villagers and family members who bravely gave their lives during both World Wars and any more recent conflicts.

Arrangements are well in hand for the annual village Christmas light turn on ceremony which this year will be held on Sunday 5th December at 5.30pm at Players Corner. We have booked Betteshanger Colliery Band to play Christmas favourites, there will be mince pies and mulled wine, a snow machine and we have been told that Santa Claus will find time to join us and distribute gifts to children. The Parish Clerk has been busy travelling to Lapland to choose a special tree which will be decorated and festooned with lights before the event. Please put this in your diaries and bring your families to enjoy good cheer at this traditional start of Christmas festivities in the village.

A meeting was held regarding the Queen's Platinum Jubilee which will take place next year over the weekend of the 2nd to 5th of June. Plans were discussed and the various village activities will soon be revealed that will take place.

The village pump has looked rather sad for some time. We have just commissioned the work to have the pump removed, sand blasted, given a fresh coat of paint and then to be re-installed, hopefully in time for Christmas. We also will try to smarten up the area around the pump.

From time to time we see drones flying over the hills around the village. This is a notice that all users must be registered and complete online training. They must also not fly their drones within 50 metres of people, vehicles or buildings unless permission has been granted by those affected.

The weather has been relatively mild and dry so far this autumn and as we go into winter I am sure we all hope that it continues to be so. As many of you know, I am involved with athletics and have recently attended a number of cross country races around Kent. The runners are certainly pleased by the forgiving conditions underfoot and hope that the usual wet and muddy conditions endured most winters may not impede their efforts later in the winter.

Thank you for reading and please remember that there will be no Parish Council meeting or Newsletter at the end of December. I wish you all a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year and look forward to writing to you again at the end of January.


We hope you all have a lovely Christmas and New Year.

One of the silliest things that was being said in December 2020 was that "Christmas is cancelled". Christmas was certainly different for everyone last year, but it will remain a constant in our lives no matter what happens around us. This year should see a return to the patterns of celebration and family gatherings, and it will be wonderful to be able to meet and enjoy the Advent and Christmas services we have planned.

Advent is the period of four Sundays and weeks before Christmas and starts on November 28th this year. Advent means 'coming' in Latin - this is the

coming of Jesus into the world. Christians use the four Sundays and weeks of Advent to prepare and remember the real meaning of Christmas. There are three meanings of 'coming' that Christians describe in Advent. The first, and most thought of, happened 2000 years ago when Jesus came into the world as a baby to live as a man and die for us. The second can happen now as Jesus comes into our lives. And the third will happen in the future when Jesus comes back to the world as King and Judge, not a baby.

Advent is a time of waiting and preparation. Waiting for Christmas – or perhaps waiting for a better world. But also waiting for Jesus to return. Jesus promised that he would return one day and that all the world would then know him as Lord and King. During Advent we remember that promise. We look forward to the time when all shall be well, and all hurts healed.

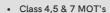

Open letter from Francois Haalebos to readers of Temple Ewell and Lydden Newsletter. :

Many of you will know that after a spell of not feeling brilliant my GP diagnosed me with Prostate Cancer in September 2020. Speedily and efficiently, I was subjected to all the required tests and biopsies etc. and the diagnosis was confirmed that I had "locally advanced prostate cancer". I was prescribed hormone treatment in November and told that this would be followed by radiotherapy early in the New Year.

After seeing the Oncologist – yes, face to face – I was told I was not suitable for radiotherapy due to "my waterworks being in such a mess" (this was historical as I had suffered from and had several urology operations during a period of more than 40yrs)! I did desperately want the radiotherapy treatment to prolong my life span so back to urology – another operation mid-April this year – Good result – I was accepted for radiotherapy. This treatment lasted from 2nd August to 29th September with daily intense treatment (not weekends thankfully). I was also thankful it was at Kent & Canterbury Hospital because several people from our area had to travel to and from Maidstone daily. I was at the hospital just after 8am daily and, on good days, was home before midday, on not so good days around 14.00 and, on one day it was even 16.00.

Anyway, I will not go into any further details but somehow the original diagnosis knocked me off my perch. I completely fell apart – went to pieces – lost the plot. This also affected my concentration and memory, for several months there were certain things I could not remember from one hour to the next. I suffered quite severely from stress and anxiety. All this time I had to not just

'self-isolate' or even shield, but cut myself off from society and the outside world entirely and completely due to COVID.

All the above just to explain and apologise for not having sent any birthday, anniversary or other occasion cards that regular recipients would have expected, including no Christmas cards! SHAME! All my life I have seen myself as the strong one that could and did support all in business and private life. I don't suppose many of you will be old enough to remember the cartoon cowboy character in the comics of the early 1950s 'Cool Hand Luke'. However, desperate the situation he was able to overcome it. In my work life I have every now and again been put forward for such occasions. Anyway, back to reality; thinking about this coming Christmas I started to get panicky and stressed about the cards to send out, so I am taking the bold step to announce already that I will not be sending out any cards and I will not expect anyone else to send me any. Sincere apologies in fact, but I am on the way back to self-control and normality in particular in that I have been able to make a sensible and rational decision in this matter and have been able to carry it out and see it through by getting it printed in time to be included in the December Newsletters. So, in anticipation MERRY CHRISTMAS to one and all and God bless you one and all.

P.S. At home we are having a major clear out and found a bag of various occasion cards. I know there are many that I have kept for sentimental reasons – but they must ALL go. Does anyone know of organisations or charities that could recycle or dispose of these? If so please phone 01304 823324 (I can deliver).



KEARSNEY ABBEY— A BRIEF HISTORY

(Taken from Kearsney Parks website)

Kearsney Abbey is a fine example of a former country house and estate. The history of the site can be traced back to the Norman Conquest when it was known as Castney Court and part of the Barony of Saye, whose men maintained and garrisoned the Saye Tower at Dover Castle.

Although never a monastic estate, it takes its name from the impressive Gothic revival manor house built between 1820-1822 by local merchant and banker, John Minet Fector. He used some of the stonework from Dover's medieval old town walls and gatehouses, demolished in the early 19th century, to build a folly in the grounds. Sections of wall, arches, gate piers and bridges within Kearsney Abbey are Grade II listed.

Most of the manor house was demolished in 1950 due to extensive dry rot. However, the former billiards room in the west wing still stands and is used today as a café. The original panelled interior and vaulted ceiling of this Grade II listed building creates the perfect ambience for a morning coffee, light lunch, or afternoon tea.
