# **Temple Ewell Parish Council**

As one crisis recedes, another is upon us. Although not completely over, the worst of Covid seems to be behind us. Infection rates remain high but the resulting illnesses are generally much milder. However, this has been replaced by the tragic situation in the Ukraine. The level of Russian aggression is quite frightening but also surprising to see in 2022. I am sure you will all agree that we hope a resolution is achieved with a minimum loss of life. Part of the crisis is the terrible refugee situation with millions of Ukranians made homeless. Some of these will be coming to the UK. If you wish to house a refugee for a minimum of 6 months see page 34.

We are currently chasing for an answer from the large contractor who we have asked if they can help with community projects to both re-surface the George and Dragon car park and create a path that would join the school path to the playing field hard standing. They are currently making their decision as to what help can be offered.

Plans continue towards the organisation of village events to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee over the 2<sup>nd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> of June. A number of village organisations are going to be involved and the events will be underwritten mainly by Parish Council. The planned activities will include:-

2<sup>nd</sup> June - A fancy dress parade for children followed by a family picnic and the village Beacon being lit.

3<sup>rd</sup> June - Songs of praise being sung in the village church followed by afternoon tea in the Baptist Church.

4<sup>th</sup> June - A party night in the Village Hall. 5<sup>th</sup> June - A Street Party on Mill Street in the afternoon.

Organisation is progressing for a repeat of the very successful music event "Rock for Rog" which ran in the King George V playing field last summer which was a very successful fund raiser for Cancer Research and was in memory of former Parish Councillor, Roger Marsden. The date will be the 30<sup>th</sup> July and plans are progressing. The event will be a similar format to that staged last year with several bands playing from 2.00pm until dusk. There will be a bar and food available. Look out for more information.

Another event that we have agreed to is an Easter Egg Hunt on the Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> April in the King George V Playing Field. More details from Alyson Grayson at The Fox Pub.

Work is in progress for the re-furbishment of the village pump on the corner of Mill Street and High Street. It will hopefully once again become a focal point of the village. Parish Councillors are hoping to see the improvements by the time you read this.

We have not had much activity on the planning front in the village recently, other than tree replacements and the odd small extension. However, we have just had an application to put 12 flats onto the yard (ex Diesel Johnnies'), by Kearsney Station. We have viewed the site and although the yard is not the prettiest part of the village (understatement), the scale of what is being proposed is very much, in our opinion, too large for the available space and of not a very pleasing design. We have made known our objections to Dover District Council and await further dialogue in working towards a design that will be acceptable and hopefully an asset to the village.

The village hall is back up and running post-covid and is making some changes to benefit the community. Firstly the "Mens Club" has been disbanded and the snooker room is being re-furbished. It will be available for anyone in the village to book and play a game of snooker on the table. Please look out for further details. Secondly, the Lower Hall is also to be re-decorated and from now on will host Parish Council Meetings.

One of the first meetings to be held will be the Annual Parish Meeting on the 26<sup>th</sup> April where we hope to have a speaker from "Channels and Choices" who occupy the site of Kearsney Manor and provide educational and welfare services to vulnerable children.


We really do seem to be well into spring now, with brighter and longer days. I also lost a number of trees and branches during the recent gales which have affected many in the village including our community run Dragon Wood. I have also started to cut the grass and it is surprising how much it has grown already! We have recently been enjoying an unusual resident in our garden in the form of a white squirrel. We understand that these are very rare with perhaps no more than 50 in the whole of the country. I have spent time doing my daily walks up on the hills and although the ground is still quite wet, there are signs that it is starting to dry out. I guess good drainage is one of the benefits of being situated on chalk downland.

I look forward to updating you next month.





those in tubs.




