Being with the vulnerable


'Anyone who welcomes a little child such as this, in my name, welcomes me... '(Mark 9.37).

I recently met with the leaders of the Sunrise Café who help the homeless and vulnerable people in Dover to find permanent accommodation. We spoke a lot about being with the vulnerable. On my return I walked past a vulnerable man who was sat on the street with an outstretched hand. He asked me for some change to buy a bite to eat. He didn't expect any response, but when I gave him £10.00, he jumped up and said, "Thank you, thank you very much." He was surprised at my generosity, but I suddenly felt a deep sadness. I was on my way to a meeting I didn't want to miss. My gift was an excuse for walking on. I had not welcomed the stranger. I had just tried to feel generous. My "generosity" had revealed a deep resistance towards welcoming the vulnerable into my life and not being with them in their daily struggles.

To welcome the vulnerable, I must become vulnerable myself. But I continue to wonder how good I am. My generosity can make me feel good. But Jesus said, 'Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all' (Mark 9.35). Am I willing to be the servant of the vulnerable in our community? By giving him £10.00 I became the master who could make him say "Thank you, thank you very much."

What would you do? Would you be with, or do to?






