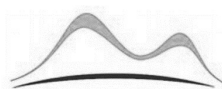

Hunting for Fossils

My father took me to the Warren, which is near Folkestone. We were looking for fossils. This is a good location as it is where the soft gault clay is being eroded by the sea. This is called the "Sulphur Band" because it is rich in iron pyrites. This band also contains many fossils and particularly brachiopods and ammonites. In our search, I picked up a stone and being only 6 years old asked my father "Is this one, Daddy?" It turns out that I had struck gold. The stone was sent to the British Museum and the Chief Palaeontologist confirmed that this fragment of fossilised wood, which contains woodworm holes, is 120 million years old. This is proof of both wood and worm over this very long period of time, which was confirmed by an expert. I still have this fossil.

Many years later, while a young adult, I was still picking things up of which I was ignorant. They were of a different nature, although I could not help but notice a similar pattern. One stone I picked up was a belief in Jesus Christ. This was pure gold. Not only did he show himself as my Saviour but also as a "Rock of Ages". This Rock is the foundation for Philosophy, Politics, Ethics, Morals and Purpose. I have proved this for myself over many years, and find it authenticated by God in his Word.

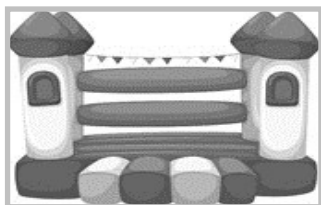

With six small diamonds for his eyes
He walks upon the summer skies,
Drawing from his silken blouse
The lacework of his dwelling house."
Can you guess what this might be? The answer is at the end.

The recent results from an insect survey showing a 60% drop in the number of insects between 2004 and 2022 are very disturbing. They play a crucial role in the food chain. Insects are eaten by most birds, which collectively consume as many as 500 million tonnes of creepy-crawlies every year. They pollinate our flowers and crops. They break down and clean up our waste and dead matter too, returning it to the soil as rich organic matter. Often we find insects a nuisance and a bit scary but it is vital to value and preserve them.

Did you know, grasshoppers existed before dinosaurs!
A ladybird might eat more than 5,000 insects in its lifetime!
A single **honeybee** colony can produce around 100kg of honey each year – that's 220 jars!

We can all play a part in helping these tiny creatures survive. On an individual level, we can all protect our own little bit of greenery. Even if you have a small garden or a window box, encourage insects by planting native plants and wildflowers, and remember, nature likes things messy and undisturbed. Enjoy a rest! Have a no mow of your lawn for a month! So remember when tempted to spray, swot or tread on an insect, preservation is the best answer.

Our plans for creating a welcoming and sustaining environment for insects, birds and small animals in the churchyard are progressing really well. One, rather chilly March morning TIDDLERS came and planted lots of “seed bombs” in what we hope will become a wild meadow. They definitely enjoyed the soft earth, digging with forks or fingers and also jumping up and down on it! The morning finished with an egg hunt and a good explore around the churchyard.

Then in April BRANCHING OUT arrived with much energy to dig and plant an amazing 70 saplings along the border fence from the Millennium Hall. It was hard work but they set to with great goodwill, being helped by Rev Ian and Malcolm. Teamwork gets things done quickly! There’s a mixture of Dog Rose, Hawthorn, Crab Apple, Dog Wood and Hazel, donated by the Woodland Trust with the canes and plastic protectors too. We will all enjoy watching a hedge grow and it’s impact on the area. It feels that the churchyard, having had a quiet sleep for many years is beginning to wake up and flourish.

“The best remedy for those who are afraid, lonely, or unhappy, is to go outside, somewhere they can be quiet, alone with the heavens, nature and God. Because only then does one feel that all is as it should be and that God wishes to see people happy, amidst the simple beauty of nature. I firmly believe that nature brings solace in all troubles.” These are words written in her diary by Anne Frank, 13 years old. Written when she was shut up in hiding with her family during WW2. Trapped into a narrow existence Anne realised the importance of things we can so easily take for granted.

So our sincere thanks go to Tiddlers and Branching Out for their help in developing and improving our churchyard, making it an even better place to enjoy Gods amazing creation in peace and wonder. It is here for us all to enjoy.

Temple Ewell Parish Council

By the time that this article is published, the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations will nearly be upon us. The Parish Council will be supporting the variety of events that are taking place across the 4 day weekend, and we are grateful to the various village organisations and their helpers for setting up these events.

Thursday 2nd June (Bank Holiday No.1) sees a Children's Fancy Dress parade, bouncy castle and obstacle course (both free) at King George V Playing Field (11am to 1pm – bring your own picnic!) followed by the lighting of the Beacon at 9.45pm; an event that is taking place across the whole country.

On Friday 3 June (Bank Holiday No.2), the Church of St. Peter & St. Paul will be hosting "Songs of Praise" from 10.30am followed by refreshments in the Millennium Hall. Meanwhile, in London, there will be a service of thanksgiving for the Queen's reign at St. Paul's Cathedral.

On Saturday, Temple Ewell Newsletter have organised a Family Fun Tea Party at the Village Hall (4-8pm) – tickets to be bought in advance are £3 Adults and £1 Children. Thank you to the Village Hall trustees for waving the hall hire fees for this event.

Last (but not least), on Sunday 5 June Mill Street will be closed from 1pm for a Street Party. This will feature Live Music, a DJ, and a Children's Entertainer. Bring your own refreshments.

Elsewhere in the village, the bench opposite players corner has been restored by Nigel Newington, our village handyman, and the WI will be adding a plaque to this bench to commemorate the Platinum Jubilee.

In other matters, I am pleased to report that after 9 months of chasing DDC, the streetlight in the middle of Dragon Wood Car Park has been restored to working order!

I recently spent a Sunday morning with the Allotments Committee; it was pleasing to see the efforts of so many who will hopefully be enjoying the fruits (and veg!) of their labours later in the Summer. There remains a lengthy waiting list for plots; demand rose significantly during Lockdown but shows no sign of diminishing.

The next Parish Council meeting is at the Village Hall (Lower Room). On Tuesday 30 May commencing at 7.15pm. This is the first meeting of the council in the new year, and as such the business will include the election of a Chairperson and Committees. Currently, we have eight Parish Councillors and therefore four vacancies – if anybody would like to become a member of the Parish Council (they must live or work within 3 miles of Temple Ewell) they can be co-opted to the Council, and then seek election in May 2023. The Council meets on the last Tuesday of each month apart from April, August & December. Please contact the Parish Clerk if you are interested in joining the Parish Council.

Lastly, a thank you to those who attended the Annual Parish Meeting at the end of April, and to those organisations who submitted reports of their activities during the preceding 12 months.

Let's hope that the current good weather stays in place into early June for the Jubilee; it would be good to see as many Parishioners as possible supporting the celebratory events over the long weekend.

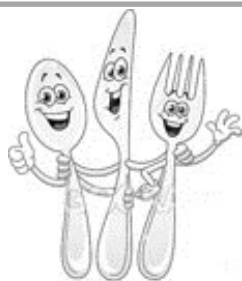

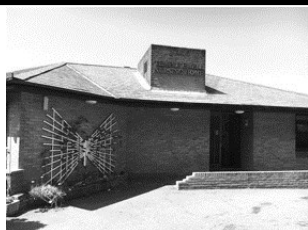
